## Defense Business and Industry

### India to Receive Remaining S-400 Units by 2026, Strengthening Defense



02-Jun-25

Russia has reaffirmed its commitment to deliver the remaining units of the S-400 air defense system to India by 2025-2026, following successful operational use during recent tensions with Pakistan. The Deputy Chief of Mission in India, Roman Babushkin, emphasized the potential for expanding bilateral defense cooperation, particularly in air defense and counter-drone technologies, acknowledging the growing drone threat seen in regional conflicts. The ongoing dialogue reflects a robust partnership with strategic importance in light of current global security challenges, reinforcing India's defense capabilities and readiness against aerial threats. This collaboration not only strengthens India's air defense but also positions it favorably in regional geopolitics.

### IAF Eyes Two Advanced Air-to-Surface Missiles After Rampage Success

The Indian Air Force (IAF) is set to enhance its precision strike capabilities by evaluating two advanced air-to-surface missile systems: the Wind Demon by Israel Aerospace Industries (IAI) and the ICE BREAKER by Rafael Advanced Defense Systems. Following the successful deployment of the Rampage missile, which effectively neutralized a Pakistan Air Force airbase, the IAF aims to maintain its technological edge in the region. The Wind Demon is noted for its versatility, real-time control features, and adaptability, while the ICE

BREAKER, a fifth-generation stealth cruise missile, boasts low observability and advanced autonomous capabilities that can operate in GPS-denied environments. Both missile systems promise significant advantages over existing platforms, particularly in deep-strike missions and engaging high-value, heavily defended targets. The potential procurement aligns with India's defense strategy to bolster deterrence against adversaries and supports the Aatmanirbhar Bharat initiative through local production in collaboration with Bharat Dynamics Limited. Overall, these advancements reflect the IAF's commitment to adapting to evolving regional security dynamics while enhancing its operational effectiveness and resilience against sophisticated air defense systems deployed by neighboring countries.

### India's Defense PSUs Set for 18% Growth Amid Military Expansion

India's defense sector is poised for substantial growth, with projections indicating that the defense budget will increase from approximately 2% to 3-4% of GDP over the next decade. This expansion is expected to position India among the top three global defense spenders by 2047. The defense public sector undertakings (PSUs) are anticipated to double their output to ₹1.8 lakh crore by 2029, reflecting an annual growth rate of 18%. Concurrently, the domestic defense production target is set to surpass ₹3 lakh crore by 2029, aiming to reduce import dependence and bolster export capabilities. The government's focus on indigenization is evident in initiatives like Operation Sindoor, which has spurred significant investments in defense infrastructure and technology. Additionally, the capital expenditure component of the defense budget is projected to grow by over 20%, underscoring a strategic commitment to

modernizing military capabilities and enhancing national security in response to evolving geopolitical challenges.

## DRDO's Project Kusha: India's Cost-Effective Long-Range Air Defense SHARE

India's Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) is progressing on Project Kusha, an indigenous long-range air defense system aimed at matching or surpassing Russia's S-400 and S-500 capabilities. The system comprises three interceptor missiles—M1 (150 km), M2 (250 km), and M3 (350 km)—designed to counter a spectrum of aerial threats, including stealth aircraft, cruise missiles, drones, and ballistic missiles. Notably, the naval variant of the M2 interceptor can engage anti-ship ballistic missiles traveling at speeds up to Mach 7, addressing the escalating global threat of high-speed ballistic missiles targeting naval assets. Project Kusha is integrated with advanced long-range surveillance and fire-control radars, equipped with Active Electronically Scanned Array (AESA) seekers and infrared and radio-frequency guidance systems to ensure precise target acquisition and high maneuverability. The M1 interceptor, based on the Akash-NG airframe, is currently in fabrication, with testing anticipated soon; prototype development is expected to conclude within 12–18 months, followed by user trials over 12–36 months. The M3 interceptor is designed to engage larger platforms such as Airborne Warning and Control Systems (AWACS) at 350 km and offers short- to medium-range ballistic missile defense. Future phases aim to develop interceptors with ranges beyond 400 km, incorporating upgraded sensors to engage hypersonic threats. Estimated at approximately USD 2.6 billion, Project Kusha supports India's "Atmanirbhar Bharat" initiative by reducing reliance on foreign defense systems, integrated into the Indian Air Force's command network to bolster strategic autonomy and protect critical infrastructure and urban centers.

## Reliance Infra Aims for ₹3,000 Crore in Defense Exports by 2025 SHARE

Reliance Infrastructure aims to achieve ₹3,000 crore in defense exports within two years, significantly increasing from its initial ₹100 crore in artillery ammunition. This ambitious target is supported by the establishment of the Dhirubhai Ambani Defence City in Maharashtra, set to be India's largest private greenfield defense initiative. With a strategic partnership with

Rheinmetall AG to supply explosives and propellants, Reliance is positioning itself in key international markets, particularly the European Union, where demand for artillery restocking is burgeoning. The company's robust manufacturing capabilities are poised to solidify its role among India's top three defense exporters, responding effectively to global supply chain needs.

## DG Propulsion Unveils Indigenous Starter Motor Controller, Boosting Aerospace Self-Reliance SHARE

DG Propulsion has achieved a significant milestone by developing an indigenous starter motor controller for jet engines, reinforcing India's commitment to self-reliance in aerospace technology. The custom-developed controller enables faster response times and better integration with engine management systems, crucial for both defense and civilian applications. With the AMCA being a cornerstone of India's air defense strategy, Samtel emphasizes its commitment to indigenous innovation, supporting self-reliance in defense technology. This development signifies a significant step in strengthening India's defense capabilities, ensuring IAF pilots have an edge in modern aerial warfare.

## Japan Offers Advanced IHI XF9-1 Engine for India's AMCA Program SHARE

The framework's ability to inspect large areas with minimal energy loss positions it as a superior alternative to traditional methods. ## ATR Plans India Manufacturing Facility to Boost Regional Aviation [SHARE](#)

## IAF Chooses Indigenous Netra AWACS Over Boeing's E-7A Wedgetail [SHARE](#)

The Indian Air Force (IAF) is prioritizing its indigenous Netra Mk1A and MkII AWACS programmes over Boeing's E-7A Wedgetail, despite Boeing's proven capabilities. This decision aligns with India's Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative, promoting self-reliance in defense. The IAF plans to acquire 12 new indigenous AWACS, enhancing operational capabilities and reducing reliance on foreign technology. The advanced GaN-based AESA radars on the Netra systems will significantly improve detection ranges and performance in electronic warfare, thereby addressing the current disparity with Pakistan's AWACS assets and ensuring enhanced airspace surveillance and coordination in future military operations.

## Uttam GaN-Based AESA Radar Production for Tejas Mk2 Begins [SHARE](#)

India's Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has begun production of the upgraded Uttam GaN-based AESA radar for the Tejas Mk2 fighter jet, featuring over 900 T/R modules and a 20-25% improved detection range. This advancement underscores India's growing competence in indigenous defense technology, aligning with the Aatmanirbhar Bharat initiative. The radar's capabilities are set to enhance the Tejas Mk2's combat effectiveness, enabling it to identify aerial threats beyond 150 kilometers while tracking multiple targets simultaneously. Scheduled for the Tejas Mk2's first prototype rollout by late 2025, this radar is pivotal in meeting contemporary air warfare standards and solidifying India's position in developing advanced military technologies.

## India Advances Air Defense with Russian Container-S Radar System [SHARE](#)

India is actively pursuing the acquisition of the advanced Russian Container-S over-the-horizon radar system, which can detect stealth aircraft and ballistic missiles from over 3,000 kilometers away, as part of its strategy to enhance air defense capabilities amid evolving regional threats. This system, along with potential procurement of the Voronezh radar, underscores India's commitment to bolstering its national defense infrastructure against adversaries like China, which is developing stealth technology. The Container-S radar's bistatic configuration and modular

design will significantly improve India's surveillance and response capabilities, ultimately strengthening its strategic military balance and defense against a variety of aerial threats.

## India Accelerates BrahMos-II Development for Mach 8 Hypersonic Strike SHARE

India is set to fast-track the development of the BrahMos-II hypersonic missile, targeting speeds of Mach 8 and a range of 1,500 km, following successful advancements in scramjet technology by DRDO. The missile, drawing inspiration from Russia's 3M22 Zircon, aims to enhance India's strategic defense capabilities amid growing global hypersonic arms competition. Initially delayed by technological and financial concerns, renewed interest in hypersonic systems has prompted India and Russia to collaborate on this project, reducing dependency on foreign technology. The BrahMos-II represents a significant leap forward, reinforcing India's commitment to indigenous defense manufacturing and technological self-reliance, aligning with the "Make in India" initiative.

### Geopolitics and Security Alliances

## India, Pakistan Military Leaders Discuss Tensions at Shangri-La SHARE

Top military officials from India and Pakistan engaged in discussions at the Shangri-La Dialogue in Singapore amidst rising tensions following a recent military confrontation. General Anil Chauhan, India's Chief of Defence Staff, highlighted India's Operation Sindoor, which targets terrorist infrastructure in response to attacks like the one in Pahalgam, emphasizing India's new red line against terrorism. In contrast, General Sahir Shamshad Mirza of Pakistan reiterated the Kashmir issue, advocating for international mediation and warning of potential "destructive escalation" if not addressed, while India firmly maintains that Kashmir is a bilateral matter. Both sides showcased their military capabilities during the confrontation, with India stressing its diversified defense procurement strategies. Despite Pakistan's calls for intervention, India continues to assert that Islamabad must first address its support for terrorism. The ongoing dialogue reflects a strategic shift from military actions to diplomatic engagements, highlighting India's proactive stance in garnering global support against cross-border terrorism while countering Pakistan's narrative on

Kashmir. This situation underscores the complexities of regional security dynamics and the importance of dialogue in preventing further conflicts.

## Ukraine's Strikes on Russian Assets: A Challenge for Istanbul Talks? SHARE

In the lead-up to the second round of peace talks between Russia and Ukraine in Istanbul, Ukraine launched a significant attack on Russian strategic aviation assets, raising concerns about the impact on negotiations. Despite the planned discussions, both sides remain far apart on key issues, with Ukraine insisting on no restrictions on its military and rejecting any Russian sovereignty claims over occupied territories. The backdrop of escalating military actions includes Ukraine's ambitious strikes targeting Russian long-range bombers, while Russia has launched significant drone attacks on Ukraine, highlighting the ongoing hostilities. U.S. involvement in the talks is anticipated, emphasizing the international dimension of the conflict. The starkly opposed positions, with Ukraine seeking reparations and a firm stance against Russian territorial claims, contrast sharply with Russian demands for Ukraine to abandon its NATO aspirations. This situation underscores the complexity of achieving a ceasefire and a lasting peace, as both nations prepare to present their respective proposals amid an intensifying military standoff. The escalating conflicts and the deepening divide between the two parties suggest that diplomatic resolution may remain elusive, reflecting the broader geopolitical tensions at play.

## Pakistani Analyst Praises IAF's Dominance in Operation Sindoor SHARE

In a notable assessment by Pakistani defense analyst Bilal Khan, the Indian Air Force (IAF) has been recognized for its superior capabilities, particularly during Operation Sindoor, which effectively neutralized the Pakistan Air Force (PAF) by targeting 12 key airbases and crippling critical infrastructure including air defense systems. This operation not only showcased India's surgical precision using advanced munitions like BrahMos and SCALP missiles but also exposed significant vulnerabilities in Pakistan's air defense, creating concerns over the PAF's ability to mount a credible counteroffensive in a potential conflict scenario. Concurrently, Khan expressed skepticism regarding Pakistan's claims of successfully targeting Indian military assets, such as the S-400 air defense systems and BrahMos cruise missiles, suggesting



these assertions lack credible evidence and may be aimed at boosting domestic morale amidst ongoing challenges. The absence of verifiable proof and independent OSINT assessments further undermine Pakistan's narrative, highlighting the complexities of information warfare between the two nations. The discussions underscore India's strategic and technological edge while questioning Pakistan's military readiness and the authenticity of its claims, reflecting a broader narrative of military modernization and preparedness that continues to shape the region's security dynamics. This analysis reinforces India's defensive posture and its proactive stance in countering perceived threats, while simultaneously revealing the challenges faced by Pakistan in addressing its own defense credibility.

## India's Strategic Shift in Response to the Turkiye-Pakistan Alliance

India's strategic recalibration in response to the deepening Turkiye-Pakistan alliance reflects a significant shift from a traditionally non-aligned stance to a more assertive, interest-driven foreign policy. The Turkiye-Pakistan partnership has intensified through joint military exercises and defense collaborations, including the use of Turkish-made drones by Pakistan in cross-border incursions, prompting India to enhance its counter-drone capabilities and expedite UAV procurements. In retaliation, India has strengthened ties with Turkiye's regional adversaries. Greece and India are set to sign their first-ever Defense Cooperation Agreement, involving joint military exercises and personnel exchanges. Armenia has procured India's Akash missile systems and other defense equipment, signaling a deepening defense relationship. These moves align with India's broader strategy to fortify partnerships across the Indo-Pacific and Middle East, counterbalancing Turkiye's influence. Domestically, India has taken several measures in aviation, tourism, and trade sectors. The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) granted IndiGo a final three-month extension on its wet lease agreement with Turkish Airlines, set to end by August 31, 2025, amid national security concerns over Turkiye's support for Pakistan. Additionally, the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security revoked the security clearance of Turkish ground handler Celebi Airport Services, impacting operations at major Indian airports. In tourism, Indian travel to Turkiye has plummeted by 60%, driven by public backlash and advisories from platforms like EaseMyTrip and Ixigo. Trade relations have also suffered; Indian traders, led by the Confederation of All India Traders (CAIT), have

initiated boycotts of Turkish products such as apples and marble, citing Turkiye's pro-Pakistan stance. These measures reflect India's shift towards an assertive, interest-driven foreign policy, leveraging economic and public sentiment to counter Turkiye's alignment with Pakistan.

## Oil Prices Soar as Russia-Ukraine Tensions Escalate

## US Senators Warn of Putin's Imminent Offensive in Ukraine

## Tharoor: No Talks with Pakistan Until Terrorism is Addressed

The clear message from Tharoor is that India prioritizes its security and dignity, remaining open to peaceful resolution only when credible actions are taken by Pakistan to address terrorism.

## Sharif: Pakistan Embraces Self-Reliance Amid Economic Struggles

In a recent address, Pakistani Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif emphasized a shift towards self-reliance and equal partnerships with allies like China and Saudi Arabia, distancing Pakistan from its history of economic dependency. He acknowledged past military tensions with India, particularly highlighting the operational challenges faced during India's Operation Sindoor, which targeted terror bases in Pakistan and resulted in significant casualties among militants. Despite his calls for leveraging domestic resources for economic growth, Sharif's statements are overshadowed by Pakistan's ongoing economic instability and dependence on foreign aid, coupled with heightened security concerns regarding India. This rhetoric reflects Pakistan's struggle to balance ambitions for autonomy with persistent vulnerabilities.

## Bangladesh Pursues South Korean Submarines, Challenging India's Naval Edge

Bangladesh is negotiating with South Korea to acquire six Improved Jang Bogo-class submarines to enhance

its naval capabilities in the Bay of Bengal, viewed as a counter to India's expanding submarine fleet. While the Jang Bogo-class is tailored for regional deterrence, India's Kalvari-class submarines are designed for power projection with advanced stealth and weaponry. India's Project-75I aims to procure advanced submarines with superior technology, including indigenous AIP systems, to maintain maritime superiority. As Bangladesh bolsters its naval presence, the strategic dynamics in the region highlight the need for India to expedite its defense modernization efforts to counter potential threats effectively.

## China Confirms Authenticity of PL-15E Missiles, Undermining Pakistan's Claims

China's Ministry of National Defence has confirmed the authenticity of the PL-15E air-to-air missiles recovered by India, directly contradicting Pakistan's Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) claims that they were fake models. This revelation raises questions about the reliability of ISPR statements and highlights the strategic implications of the PL-15E's deployment by the Pakistan Air Force. The incident, which occurred during aerial skirmishes following India's Operation Sindoor, represents a significant intelligence achievement for India, as the missiles' components could potentially be reverse-engineered. China's confirmation also suggests underlying tensions in its defense relationship with Pakistan, emphasizing the importance of technological credibility in military engagements.

## Indian Defense Experts Advise Russia to Adopt Anti-Drone Tech

The Indian defense community has urged Russia to adopt its combat-tested anti-drone systems following unverified reports from Russian media suggesting losses of Indian Air Force jets, reportedly influenced by Pakistani narratives. India's indigenously developed systems have proven effective against drone threats, contrasting sharply with Russia's struggles against low-cost Ukrainian drones. Indian analysts assert that these systems, which include both hard-kill and soft-kill technologies, could enhance Russia's counter-drone capabilities at a fraction of the cost. This situation emphasizes India's growing confidence in its military technologies and the importance of factual reporting over disinformation in contemporary defense discourse.

## Military Operations

### Ukrainians Unveil Strategy Behind Major Drone Strike on Russia SHARE

Ukrainian forces executed a significant drone strike on Russian aviation assets, marking a pivotal escalation in their military strategy. The operation, dubbed "Web" by Ukraine's Security Service (SBU), involved smuggling first-person view (FPV) drones into Russia, concealed in mobile wooden cabins mounted on trucks. Over 117 drones were launched against airfields deep inside Russian territory, reportedly hitting strategic bomber aircraft and damaging or destroying 41 planes, which could represent up to 34% of Russia's air missile carrier fleet. U.S. officials noted the sophistication of this operation was unprecedented, with a reach into areas like Irkutsk and Murmansk, where long-range nuclear-capable bombers are stationed. This audacious maneuver reflects Ukraine's innovative approach to drone warfare, emphasizing the ongoing shift in tactical dynamics within the conflict. The operation not only signifies Ukraine's growing capabilities but also serves as a strategic message to Russia and its military establishment, especially as the war enters a more unpredictable phase with potential implications for future peace negotiations.

### Border Tensions Rise as Indian Forces Target Myanmar Rebels SHARE

The Indian Army's recent operation resulted in the deaths of ten Myanmar rebels, causing panic among border communities and raising concerns about the breakdown of an informal understanding between Indian forces and Myanmar's government-in-exile. While the Indian Army claims the operation was a response to armed insurgent activity, the NUG disputes this, alleging extrajudicial killings. This incident coincides with India's efforts to fence its border with Myanmar, a move seen as crucial for security but also as exacerbating ethnic tensions. Analysts warn that these developments could reshape relations between Indian forces and Myanmar's resistance groups, potentially leading to increased instability along the border.

### Army and Assam Rifles rescue over 500 civilians in Manipur floods. SHARE

This initiative aligns with India's evolving security doctrine, emphasizing inter-agency collaboration and readiness against multifaceted threats such as terrorism and cyber warfare. Furthermore, it complements international efforts like Exercise Tiger Triumph 2025, a bilateral India-U.S. tri-service drill focusing on maritime and humanitarian operations, highlighting India's commitment to enhancing defense capabilities through both domestic and international collaborations.

## Indian Army Neutralizes 67 Unexploded Shells in Poonch Villages

## Landslide at Sikkim Army camp claims 3 lives, 6 missing

A devastating landslide struck the Indian Army camp at Chhaten near Lachen in North Sikkim on Sunday evening, June 1, 2025, around 7 PM, claiming the lives of three personnel—Havaldar Lakhwinder Singh, Lance Naik Munish Thakur, and porter Abhishek Lakhada. The disaster, triggered by relentless heavy rainfall that swelled the Teesta River, also left six individuals missing, including Lt Col Pritpal Sandhu, his wife, retired Squadron Leader Arati B. Sandhu, their daughter Amaira, Subedar Dharamveer, Sepoy Sainudheen P.K., and Sepoy Sunilal Muchahary. Four others were rescued with minor injuries. Rescue operations, led by the Army and supported by local volunteers, continue under challenging conditions of unstable terrain and adverse weather. The landslide caused extensive damage, including cracked roads and a partially damaged Phidang Bailey Bridge in Dzongu. The Indian Army has extended heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families and assured full support. This incident underscores the vulnerability of the region to natural disasters, especially during the monsoon season, and highlights the resilience and dedication of the Army personnel in the face of adversity.

## Pakistan's Drone Deficit Grows After Failed Offensive Against India

Pakistan has reportedly depleted its stockpile of Turkish-made drones following a failed drone offensive against India, where approximately 300-400 UAVs were launched but largely intercepted by India's advanced air defense systems. This operational failure has prompted Pakistan to consider procuring more drones from Turkey to replenish its arsenal, raising questions about the reliability of Turkish drone technology in high-intensity conflicts. The incident underscores Pakistan's vulnerability due to its reliance on foreign suppliers and highlights the effectiveness of India's integrated air defenses, particularly the indigenous Akashteer system, which successfully neutralized the threat posed by these drones. This failure not only impacts Pakistan's military strategy but also potentially undermines Turkey's standing in the global drone market.



## Terrorism and Counterterrorism

### India's Military Evolution: From Restraint to Proactive Defense SHARE

India's military doctrine has shifted markedly from strategic restraint to proactive defense, exemplified by Operation Sindoor—a decisive response to the April 22, 2025, Pahalgam terror attack that claimed 26 lives. The operation showcased India's advanced military capabilities and sent a strong deterrent message to Pakistan and the international community, reflecting a transformation in India's global military image from soft to hard power. The dialogue highlighted contrasting perspectives: India positioned itself as a responsible power enforcing hard lines against terrorism, while Pakistan attempted to internationalize the Kashmir issue amidst accusations of harboring terror groups. General Chauhan also underscored the evolving nature of warfare, emphasizing the need for India to adapt continually to emerging threats, including cyber warfare and advanced technologies. International reactions, particularly from the U.S. and China, indicate recognition of India's growing military assertiveness and strategic autonomy, challenging historical alliances and prompting a reevaluation of geopolitical dynamics in South Asia. These developments underscore India's commitment to regional security and counter-terrorism, signaling a broader shift in the global order where India asserts itself as a formidable military power.

### Indian Delegation Honors 26/11 Victim, Strengthens Anti-Terrorism Ties in Malaysia SHARE

An Indian all-party delegation, led by JD-U MP Sanjay Kumar Jha, paid tribute to a Malaysian victim of the 26/11 Mumbai terror attack during their visit to Kuala Lumpur, reinforcing India's strong anti-terror stance. ### 16 Naxalites Surrender, Kerlapenda Declared Maoist-Free SHARE

Sixteen Naxalites, including six with a total cash reward of Rs 25 lakh, surrendered in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district, making Kerlapenda village Maoist-free and eligible for Rs 1 crore in development projects under the state's new rehabilitation policy. The surrender, driven by disillusionment with Maoist ideology, reflects the effectiveness of the Chhattisgarh government's initiatives aimed at promoting peace and development in tribal areas. This marks the second village in Sukma to rid itself of Naxalism through the state's Naxal Surrender/Victim Relief and Rehabilitation Policy-2025, signaling a positive trend in combating insurgency and fostering local governance and development.

### Punjab Police dismantles Babbar Khalsa-linked terror extortion ring. SHARE

Punjab Police successfully dismantled a terror and extortion module linked to the banned Babbar Khalsa International, arresting two associates involved in a scheme targeting individuals in Punjab and Canada. The operatives were allegedly instructed to fire at a furniture shop in Amritsar as part of an extortion attempt. In a separate operation, police intercepted suspects and recovered eight foreign-made pistols, indicating a broader transnational criminal network. These actions highlight Punjab Police's proactive measures in countering terrorism and organized crime, underscoring their commitment to maintaining law and order in the region amid ongoing security challenges. Enhanced vigilance and swift action are crucial in disrupting such networks.

### India and Algeria Strengthen Counter-Terrorism Ties Against Pakistan SHARE

### **Cybersecurity Alert: 184 Million Passwords Exposed in Breach**

A massive cybersecurity breach has exposed over 184 million records, including plain-text passwords and direct login links, posing significant risks for users of major platforms like Apple, Google, and Facebook. The easily accessible data allows cybercriminals to bypass traditional security measures, potentially leading to identity theft and financial fraud. Experts warn that the rise of cloud services has contributed to this vulnerability, with 82% of breaches linked to misconfigured cloud storage. To mitigate risks, individuals are advised to change passwords, enable multi-factor authentication, freeze credit, and monitor their accounts for suspicious activity. This incident underscores the urgent need for enhanced cybersecurity measures in an increasingly digital world.

## Air India Adjusts Maintenance Plans Amid Rising National Sentiment
