DRDO Successfully Tests Indigenous Life Support System for LCA Tejas Share

05-Mar-25

The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully conducted high-altitude trials of its Indigenous Integrated Life Support System (ILSS) for the LCA Tejas aircraft, utilizing an On-Board Oxygen Generating System (OBOGS). The ILSS demonstrated its capability to function effectively at altitudes of 50,000 feet and during high-G maneuvers, achieving stringent aeromedical standards. With 90% indigenous content, this system enhances India's self-reliance in aerospace technology and could be adapted for other the MiG-29K. This aircraft like achievement underscores India's commitment to advancing defense technologies and aligns with the vision of Viksit Bharat 2047, showcasing robust collaboration between DRDO, HAL, and Indian industry partners.

Ka-226T and Ansat to be Enhanced with New VK-650V Engine S SHARE

Indian Army and TCOE Partner to Boost Air Delivery Systems S SHARE

Indian Navy Enhances Strength with Induction of INS Himagiri and

With a focus on multi-role capabilities, they are equipped for anti-air, anti-surface, and anti-submarine operations, enhancing the Navy's operational versatility. Their advanced stealth technologies and integrated combat management systems position them as critical assets in safeguarding vital sea lanes in the Indo-Pacific, addressing challenges like piracy and territorial disputes, while reflecting a maturing domestic defense ecosystem.

India's Plasma Stealth Device: A Breakthrough in Radar Evasion S SHARE

India is advancing its defense capabilities with the development of an innovative plasma stealth device aimed at significantly reducing the radar cross-section (RCS) of military assets. Utilizing rectangular and elliptical tiles in plasma chambers, this technology absorbs and deflects radar waves, enhancing the survivability of military platforms. Experimental tests in both controlled and outdoor settings have shown promising reductions in RCS, showcasing the technology's potential against various radar systems. Unlike traditional stealth methods, plasma-based stealth offers a dynamic, adjustable solution, though challenges remain in operational deployment regarding power and integration with existing systems, positioning India as a key player in global stealth technology research.

LUH Program Under Scrutiny: Test Pilot Flags Design Concerns S SHARE

India's Light Utility Helicopter (LUH) program, developed by Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL), faces serious scrutiny due to design flaws highlighted by a senior test Concerns about the LUH's autorotation performance and directional stability suggest it may not meet critical safety standards, which could endanger pilots during emergency scenarios. Despite the program's ambition to enhance India's self-reliance in rotorcraft production, unresolved issues threaten operational timelines and could lead to reliance on foreign alternatives. The situation calls for urgent transparency and accountability from HAL, as any delays in certification and induction may exacerbate existing rotorcraft shortages within the Indian armed forces.

Indian Navy to Test DRDO's VSHORADS for Enhanced Defense on Warships S SHARE

The Indian Navy is set to test the Defence Research and Development Organisation's (DRDO) Very Short Range Air Defence System (VSHORADS) for integration into its frontline warships as a Close-In Weapon System (CIWS). This adaptation aims to enhance naval defensive capabilities against a spectrum of aerial and surface threats, particularly cruise missiles and drones. Positioned below the Vertical Launch Short Range Surface to Air Missile (VL-SRSAM) in the defensive hierarchy, the VSHORADS-based CIWS will offer a quick-reaction capability to counter smaller, faster-moving targets, thereby significantly bolstering the Navy's operational readiness and modernizing its arsenal by replacing older systems like the Barak-I missiles.

Tejas MkII to Integrate CATS Warrior UAVs for Advanced Combat S SHARE

The Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA) and Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) are integrating the Tejas MkII fighter jet with semi-autonomous UAVs, known as CATS Warrior loyal wingmen, utilizing advanced AI technologies for coordinated operations. This initiative aims to enhance combat capabilities in high-threat environments, allowing manned and

unmanned platforms to collaborate effectively. The Tejas MkII will serve as a testbed for these technologies, which will later benefit India's Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA). The development of loyal wingman drones signifies a strategic advancement in India's defense capabilities, elevating operational flexibility and effectiveness in modern warfare while reinforcing India's commitment to enhancing its indigenous defense industry.

Pakistan Air Force Plans All-5th Gen Fighter Fleet by 2047 Share

The Pakistan Air Force (PAF) is pursuing an ambitious plan to establish an all-5th generation fighter fleet by 2047, driven by its Project Azm, alongside potential acquisitions of China's FC-31 and Turkey's TF-X. However, PAF faces significant challenges, including financial constraints, technological hurdles, and the need for extensive operational integration. Navy Supports TEDBF Program as 5th Gen Minus Fighter Advances S SHARE

India's Twin Engine Deck-Based Fighter (TEDBF) program is advancing steadily, with the Navy committed to its 5th Gen Minus classification despite speculation about a full fifth-generation upgrade. This pragmatic approach highlights the Navy's focus on balancing capabilities such as maritime strike and air defense with cost-effectiveness, opting for features like stealth coatings and semi-recessed weapon layouts to manage radar signatures while maintaining operational flexibility.

India Unveils Jalkapi XLUUV: 20-Ton Submarine with 45-Day Endurance S SHARE

India's defense sector has reached a significant milestone with the development of the Jalkapi XLUUV,

an Extra-Large Unmanned Underwater Vehicle weighing 20 tons and capable of operating autonomously for 30 to 45 days. This innovative submarine, showcased at Aero India 2025, enhances the Indian Navy's underwater capabilities in the strategically vital Indian Ocean Region. Developed by Rekise Marine, it features advanced sensors for comprehensive surveillance and autonomous navigation. The Jalkapi's design and operational depth make it versatile for various missions, including anti-submarine warfare and electronic surveillance, marking a noteworthy step towards self-reliance in defense technology and highlighting the vital role of India's private sector in defense innovation.

Defense Policy and Budgeting

Rajnath Singh: Embracing Advanced Solutions for Modern Security Threats Share

Defense Minister Rajnath Singh emphasized the need for advanced solutions to counter rapidly evolving security threats, such as cyberattacks and space-based espionage, during the DRDO Collaboration Conference. He highlighted the importance of a holistic approach to national security, urging institutions to collaborate and break silos to adapt to unconventional threats. Singh praised the DRDO for enhancing India's defense capabilities, noting the development of critical technologies for internal security, including small arms and surveillance equipment. The minister's call for timely deployment of scalable products underlines the commitment to equip security forces with modern tools to address contemporary challenges effectively.

Geopolitics and Security Alliances

France Warns Against Seizing Russian Assets for Ukraine Aid S SHARE

European nations are debating the use of frozen Russian assets to support Ukraine amid shifting U.S. military aid policies under President Trump. France's Finance Minister has expressed caution against outright asset seizures, citing international law and financial stability risks, while advocating for utilizing only the interest generated from these assets. The G7 has previously agreed to channel funds from frozen

assets, with estimates of interest earnings potentially reaching up to €20 billion by 2027. However, the proposal for outright confiscation has sparked division within Europe, with the UK supporting it while France and Germany remain wary, emphasizing the need for legal and economic prudence. Ultimately, this situation highlights the complexities of international law and the geopolitical ramifications of financial strategies in the ongoing conflict between Russia and Ukraine.

Bangladesh Eyes Closer Ties with India, Urges Visa Resumption S SHARE

Foreign Secretary Misri to Visit Russia on March 7 for Talks Share

Germany Eyes Major Rearmament Amid US Commitment Concerns S SHARE

US reportedly halts intelligence sharing with Ukraine, sparking concerns. Share

The U.S. has reportedly cut off intelligence-sharing with Ukraine, potentially hindering its military operations against Russian forces, according to the Financial Times. However, a Kyiv official claims that intelligence continues to flow from the U.S., as stated by Bloomberg News. This situation indicates a complex dynamic in U.S.-Ukraine relations, where intelligence gaps may affect the efficacy of Ukrainian operations. The uncertainty surrounding the intelligence-sharing policy raises concerns about the overall strategy of Western allies in supporting Ukraine against Russian aggression, further complicating the geopolitical landscape in Eastern Europe.

Briton Sentenced to 19 Years in Russia for Fighting in Ukraine S SHARE

A Russian court sentenced British citizen James Scott Rhys Anderson to 19 years in prison for participating in the conflict for Ukraine as a mercenary. Captured during Kyiv's offensive, he was charged with a "terrorist act" after admitting to fighting for financial gain, reportedly receiving approximately \$400 monthly. This case highlights Russia's stance on foreign fighters, categorizing them as mercenaries rather than prisoners of war, which raises critical questions about international norms and the treatment of combatants. Such legal actions reflect Russia's broader strategy to deter foreign involvement in the Ukraine conflict while asserting control over narratives surrounding the conflict's conduct.

Belgium seeks to enhance defense ties with India for strategic autonomy. Share

Belgium's Foreign Minister Maxime Prevot emphasized the need for Europe to develop strategic autonomy in defense during a visit to India, highlighting India's potential role in bolstering European military capacity. This aligns with a prospective defense pact between India and Belgium, as the Belgian delegation, led by Princess Astrid, met with PM Modi. Prevot acknowledged the changing global landscape, underscoring the importance of flexibility and unity within the EU while maintaining strong ties with the US. US Engages in Secret Talks with Hamas on Hostage Release Share

With trade between India and the UAE exceeding \$85 billion, the corridor also seeks to bolster energy cooperation and digital connectivity while addressing regional challenges. This collaboration underscores the commitment to deepen bilateral ties and enhance global economic connectivity, positioning India strategically against evolving geopolitical dynamics.

J&K Assembly Erupts Over NC Call for Talks with Pakistan Share

An uproar in the Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly arose when NC leader Ali Mohammad Sagar called for renewed talks with Pakistan, prompting BJP MLA Sunil Kumar Sharma to assert that terrorism and dialogue are incompatible. Sharma challenged the NC's consistent push for talks despite claims of sacrifice, while another NC MLA raised concerns about escalating drug abuse in the region. The government acknowledged a rise in inpatient addiction cases but noted an overall decrease in registered drug addiction cases, attributing improvements to initiatives like the Nasha Mukht Abhiyan. This debate underscores the complexities of security, governance, and public health in J&K, highlighting differing political viewpoints on engagement with Pakistan amidst local challenges.

Military Operations

New Israeli military chief takes command amid Gaza tensions S SHARE

Israel has appointed Eyal Zamir as its new military chief amid ongoing tensions and a fragile ceasefire with Hamas, following the significant security failures during the October 7, 2023, attacks. Zamir, who has a robust military background including key operations during previous conflicts, replaces General Herzi Halevi, who resigned after admitting shortcomings in response efforts. The new commander emphasized a

commitment to achieving "absolute victory" over Hamas and restoring national unity, signaling a tough stance against both Hamas and Iranian influence in the region. Prime Minister Netanyahu has echoed support for Zamir, highlighting the importance of U.S. assistance in bolstering Israel's military capabilities and achieving strategic objectives. This leadership change occurs in a context where Israel has faced international scrutiny over its military actions in Gaza and broader geopolitical challenges, and Zamir's experience and assertive approach are expected to shape Israel's operations moving forward, particularly regarding the remaining hostages and ongoing conflict dynamics in Gaza and Lebanon.

Indian Army Leads Rescue Efforts After Telangana Tunnel Collapse S SHARE

The Indian Armed Forces are actively aiding the ongoing rescue operations following the collapse of the Srisailam Left Bank Canal (SLBC) tunnel in Telangana, where eight individuals have been trapped since February 22, 2025. Efforts include dewatering, desilting, and debris removal, utilizing advanced equipment like conveyor belts and excavators. Despite the challenges posed by muck and water, the restoration of the conveyor belt has accelerated debris clearance. Additionally, a robotics team is exploring the use of robots for further operations, while scientists from the National Centre of Seismology are conducting seismic studies. The involvement of multiple agencies, including the Indian Army, Navy, and National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), highlights India's commitment to a coordinated and vigorous rescue effort, showcasing the nation's resilience and capability in crisis management.

The Indian Army Chief expressed apprehension over the potential use of Bangladeshi territory by Pakistani officials for terrorism targeted at India. J-K Police and Army Conduct Mock Drill at Wanpoh Station Share

CRPF Officer and Two Jawans Injured in Maoist IED Blast Share

A CRPF Assistant Commandant and two jawans were injured in an IED blast by Maoists in Jharkhand's Chaibasa district during an anti-Maoist operation. They were promptly airlifted to Ranchi for medical treatment. This incident underscores the ongoing conflict as security forces have recently dismantled multiple Maoist hideouts, seizing a significant cache of weapons, including a US-made M-16 rifle. Union Home Minister Amit Shah has indicated that the government's anti-Maoist operations are nearing completion, with an aim to eradicate Maoism by March 2026, highlighting the Indian government's commitment to restoring order and security in affected regions.

India's Air Power Faces Challenges Amid Regional Jet Buildup. SHARE

India's air power faces challenges as its fleet shrank by 151 aircraft over the past decade, while China and Pakistan increased their numbers significantly. The Indian Air Force (IAF) currently operates 31 squadrons against a sanctioned strength of 42, raising concerns about aerial readiness. In response, India is implementing a robust indigenous expansion plan focused on the Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas and the Multi-Role Fighter Aircraft (MRFA) program, which aims to procure 114 jets through international collaborations. Despite these efforts, the IAF's reliance on aging platforms underscores an urgent need to enhance capabilities amid evolving regional dynamics.

Army Jawan Dies in Baramulla; Suicide Suspected Amid Security Threats Share

This initiative aligns with the central government's internship program and contributes to the broader goal of achieving Viksit Bharat by 2047. The establishment of such a lab is crucial for nurturing future cyber leaders and enhancing cybersecurity landscape, ultimately driving innovation and resilience.

Survey: Cybersecurity and AI Lead Emerging Governance Risks in

A recent survey by IIA-Protiviti India emphasizes that emerging governance risks, particularly in cybersecurity and artificial intelligence (AI), are critical for Indian enterprises. Strengthening Cybersecurity in India's Emerging Tier-2 Cities Share

Pune Man Arrested for Running Fake Army Recruitment Scam Share

A defense civilian employee, Subhash Magan Pawar, was arrested in Pune for allegedly running a fake recruitment racket targeting job aspirants for the Indian Army, deceiving them with false job promises and charging around 4.3 lakh each. The operation, led by the Army's Military Intelligence and local police, followed a tip-off regarding Pawar's fraudulent activities, which reportedly affected candidates from financially disadvantaged backgrounds. The investigation began after one victim claimed to have paid 8 lakh, and authorities are now interrogating the accused to uncover the full extent of the scam. This incident highlights the need for increased vigilance against such fraudulent schemes that exploit vulnerable aspirants.

Army probes Brigadier for alleged assault on soldiers at home S SHARE

The Indian Army has initiated an inquiry into allegations that a serving Brigadier assaulted soldiers assigned to his official residence in Poonch on March 1. Reports indicate that the Brigadier's cook was reportedly slapped and abused, with a replacement cook also being subjected to violence. The Army has committed to a fair and transparent investigation, emphasizing the importance of maintaining morale and discipline within its ranks. While this incident raises concerns about conduct, the Army's swift response underscores its commitment to accountability and operational integrity, ensuring that the overall situation remains stable and under control.

Miscellaneous

Karnataka Minister Orders Reclamation of 444 Acres from IAF Share

Karnataka Forest Minister Eshwar Khandre has ordered the reclamation of 444 acres of forest land illegally held by the Indian Air Force (IAF) in Bengaluru, a decision stemming from a 2017 government order that reclassified the land as reserved forest. Originally allotted to the IAF in 1987, the area was declared

protected after violations of forest laws were flagged by the CAG. Despite this, construction activities began without the necessary Forest Clearance, prompting the Minister to instruct officials to take legal action and seek compliance from the IAF. This situation highlights the government's strong commitment to environmental protection and adherence to regulations, reinforcing the importance of balancing defense activities with ecological preservation.

China Strikes Back: Imposes Tariffs on U.S. Food Imports Strikes

China has responded decisively to U.S. President Trump's new tariffs, which increased duties on Chinese imports to 20%. SpaceX Delays Starship's Eighth Test Due to Booster Issues Starship's Share

SpaceX has postponed the eighth test of its Starship rocket due to issues with both the Super Heavy booster and the Starship spacecraft, halting the launch attempt at T-40 seconds. Initial problems with the booster were seemingly resolved, but further complications with Ship 34 prompted a thorough inspection. CEO Elon Musk emphasized the need for clarity before proceeding, signaling a commitment to safety. This test is vital for SpaceX's goal of developing a reusable rocket for missions to the moon and Mars, showcasing the challenges inherent in cutting-edge space exploration technology and the importance of meticulous preparation.

PM Modi and Princess Astrid Discuss Expanding India-Belgium Ties Share

Google's Sycamore processor. It reflects a broader competition in advanced technology between nations, particularly in areas impacting national security, artificial intelligence, and more. Delhi High Court Grants Bail to Christian Michel in Chopper Scam S SHARE

The Delhi High Court granted bail to Christian Michel, an alleged middleman in the Rs 3,600-crore AgustaWestland chopper scam, after he spent over six years in custody without trial. The court acknowledged his prolonged detention violated his right to a speedy trial, particularly as the investigation remains incomplete. Despite the Enforcement Directorate's concerns about Michel being a flight risk, the judge emphasized the need for trial expediency. This case highlights systemic issues in judicial processes and the importance of timely justice, which is essential for maintaining public confidence in the legal system and accountability in defense procurement.

Assam CM Eyes Interpol in Probe Tied to Congress MP's Wife S SHARE

Income Tax Department to Access Your Digital Accounts from 2026 S SHARE

Starting April 1, 2026, India's income tax department will acquire the authority to access individuals' social media, emails, and digital assets if they suspect tax evasion, extending their powers under the new Income Tax Bill. While aimed at curbing undisclosed income, experts raise concerns over potential privacy infringements and lack of judicial oversight, deeming the expansive definitions of virtual digital space as vague and prone to abuse.
