### Bharat Forge Wins Bid for 307 ATAGS Howitzers, Boosting Defense Share

05-Nov-24

Bharat Forge has been selected as the lowest bidder for the Indian Army's tender to produce 307 Advanced Towed Artillery Gun Systems (ATAGS), valued at around ₹6,000 crore. This project is pivotal for enhancing India's artillery capabilities, aligning with the "Make in India" initiative to bolster indigenous defense manufacturing. Bharat Forge will manufacture 60% of the howitzers, with TATA Advanced Systems producing the remaining 40%, fostering collaboration within the defense sector. The ATAGS is a cutting-edge 155mm, 52-caliber howitzer designed to modernize the Indian Army's artillery and has already demonstrated its effectiveness in various conditions, including high altitudes. The order is expected to be placed within the current financial year, significantly contributing to India's strategic military readiness along its borders with China and Pakistan.

#### Indian Army Welcomes 550 'Asmi' Machine Pistols to Northern

The Indian Army has inducted 550 'Asmi' machine pistols into its Northern Command, marking a significant advancement in self-reliance in defense manufacturing. This machine pistol, designed for close-quarter combat, is a collaborative project involving Colonel Prasad Bansod, the Indian Army, and the DRDO. This initiative is in line with Prime Minister Modi's 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' campaign, which emphasizes enhancing domestic defense production capabilities. The induction of the 'Asmi' not only strengthens the Army's operational effectiveness but also showcases India's commitment to developing indigenous defense solutions, reinforcing national security while reducing dependency on foreign arms.

#### Su-57 "Felon" Debuts at Zhuhai, Sparks Aero India 2025 Buzz Share

The Russian Su-57 stealth fighter made its international debut at the Zhuhai Airshow 2024, highlighting Moscow's intent to promote its fifth-generation aircraft globally. Piloted by Sergey Bogdan, the Su-57 showcases advanced technology and maneuverability,

attracting interest from the Indian defense community amid India's efforts to modernize its Air Force. Although India has not committed to acquiring the Su-57, its potential presence at Aero India 2025 could foster collaboration and technology transfers, especially in stealth capabilities. While the aircraft faces criticism regarding production timelines and design flaws, its showcasing at Zhuhai underscores Russia's strategic military partnerships, particularly with China, potentially impacting regional defense dynamics and arms sales in Asia.

## HAL Delays Tejas Mk1A Handover Due to Radar and Software Issues Share

Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) has faced delays in delivering the first Tejas Mk1A fighter jet to the Indian Air Force (IAF) due to complex radar integration and software upgrades. The integration of the ELTA ELM-2052 AESA radar, essential for enhancing the jet's capabilities, has required extensive testing and collaboration with ELTA Systems, while last-minute software changes requested by the IAF have necessitated further adjustments. Despite these challenges, HAL remains committed to ensuring the aircraft meets the IAF's high operational standards, emphasizing quality and safety in the development process. This careful approach highlights HAL's dedication to delivering a superior product to bolster India's air defense capabilities.

## Pakistan Navy Unveils SMASH Missile, Boosting Maritime Power SHARE

The Pakistan Navy recently test-fired the SMASH missile, a ship-based ballistic missile with a range of 350 kilometers, believed to be based on China's CM-401 design. This missile enhances Pakistan's maritime capabilities, featuring advanced maneuverability and precision targeting against naval assets. Analysts highlight Pakistan's heavy reliance on Chinese technology across its missile programs, suggesting that many systems, including the SMASH, exhibit design similarities with Chinese counterparts, allowing Pakistan to bolster its military presence without development. extensive domestic This partnership between China and Pakistan underscores a strategic shift in regional deterrence dynamics, necessitating India to expedite the enhancement of its own naval and missile defense systems to counter emerging threats effectively.

### DRDO Unveils Indigenous Electronic Warfare System for Do-228 Share

The DRDO has developed advanced Electronic Support Measures (ESM) modules for the Indian Navy's Do-228 aircraft, enhancing India's maritime defense capabilities under Project SHYEN S-22. This indigenous technology enables effective detection and identification of threats analyzing radar signals, thereby reducina by dependence on foreign suppliers. Key features include wide-band signal detection and real-time threat alerts, crucial for monitoring India's extensive maritime territories. This development not only strengthens the Navy's operational readiness but also aligns with India's strategic goal of bolstering its indigenous defense industry, ensuring self-reliance in critical military technologies.

## Pakistan Pursues Russia's S-350 After S-400 Request Denied Share

Pakistan is seeking to acquire Russia's S-350 Vityaz air defence system after its request for the more advanced S-400 was denied, reflecting Russia's strategic balancing in South Asia to prevent an arms race with India, which already operates the S-400. The S-350, while less sophisticated, still enhances Pakistan's air defence capabilities against aerial threats. This situation underscores the complexities of regional geopolitics, as Russia aims to maintain its long-standing defence partnership with India and mitigate tensions in the area. Ultimately, the development could influence the regional security dynamics as Pakistan bolsters its air defence capabilities amidst historical rivalries.

#### Keel Laid for India's First Two Next Gen Offshore Patrol Vessels SHARE

05-Nov-24

The keel laying ceremony for the first two Next Generation Offshore Patrol Vessels (NGOPVs), Yard 3037 and 3038, took place at Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers Ltd in Kolkata on November 5, 2024. The Indian Ministry of Defence has contracted the construction of 11 NGOPVs to bolster coastal defense, surveillance, and anti-piracy efforts, aligning with the Aatmanirbhar Bharat and Make in India initiatives. This milestone underscores India's commitment to enhancing indigenous shipbuilding capabilities and strengthening maritime security. The NGOPVs, with a tonnage of approximately 3000T,

represent a significant advancement in the Indian Navy's operational readiness and self-reliance.

## Rafale M Triumphs Over F/A-18 Super Hornet in Navy Trials Share

The Indian Navy's trials at INS Hansa evaluated the Dassault Rafale M and Boeing's F/A-18E/F Super Hornet for carrier-based operations, with the Rafale M emerging as the preferred option due to its integrated Infrared Search and Track (IRST) system. The lack of an IRST on the Super Hornet, combined with operational limitations and developmental delays of its podded alternative, diminished its appeal. The Rafale M's compatibility with the Indian Air Force's existing fleet enhances operational efficiency and cost-effectiveness. As modern warfare increasingly prioritizes stealth and surprise, the Rafale M's advanced features align closely with the Indian Navy's strategic needs, underscoring its superiority in the trials.

## DRDO Boosts ALWT Speed by 42% with New Battery Technology SHARE

The DRDO is enhancing the Advanced Light-Weight Torpedo (ALWT) with a new 100 kW Magnesium-Silver Chloride battery, increasing its speed from 33 knots to 47 knots—a 42% boost aimed at improving antisubmarine warfare capabilities for the Indian Navy. This upgrade is crucial for engaging fast-moving submarines and minimizes their escape options, enhancing the effectiveness of India's indigenous defense technology. The Mg-AgCl battery's high power density and reliability make it ideal for meeting the operational demands of the ALWT, allowing it to cover greater distances quickly. Overall, this advancement strengthens India's maritime defense posture in the Indian Ocean Region.

## China Launches J-35A Fighter: 11 Features for India to Note S SHARE

China has unveiled the J-35A, its latest fifth-generation fighter, at the Zhuhai Airshow 2024, showcasing significant advancements in air combat technology. The aircraft features notable enhancements, including a new radome for improved stealth, an Electro-Optical Targeting System for precision targeting, and a redesigned air intake for better airflow and radar evasion. The J-35A's evolution reflects China's strategy to bolster its military capabilities, particularly in land-based operations. India should remain vigilant, as the J-35A's advancements pose a strategic challenge,

necessitating continued investment in its own defense capabilities to ensure air superiority and maintain regional stability.

## HAL Delays Tejas Mk1A Production Due to Engine Shortage Share

Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) is experiencing significant delays in the production of the indigenous Tejas Mk1A Light Combat Aircraft due to a shortage of F-404 engines from GE Aerospace, pushing the rollout from November 2023 to March 2025. This setback hampers HAL's plans to boost manufacturing at its new Nashik plant, which was intended to increase production to meet the Indian Air Force's requirement for 83 jets. The supply chain disruptions impacting global aerospace production have become a critical obstacle, highlighting the need for a robust domestic supply chain to ensure timely defense manufacturing and enhance India's self-reliance in military capabilities.

### DRDO to Test Durability of New Generation Anti-Radiation Missile Share

05-Nov-24

The DRDO is set to conduct an Accelerated Ageing Test (AAT) on India's New Generation Anti-Radiation Missile (NGARM), or Rudram-1, to assess its shelf life and operational readiness under extreme conditions. The AAT involves exposing the missile's propulsion system and propellant cartons to elevated temperatures, simulating long-term environmental effects. This testing is vital for ensuring reliability and predicting material degradation over time, which is crucial for modern defense systems. As India's first indigenously developed anti-radiation missile, the Rudram-1 aims to enhance the Indian Air Force's capability by targeting enemy radar and electronic warfare platforms, thereby weakening adversarial air defense networks.

## Saab India pitches Gripen-E for IAF MRFA, vows local weapon integration. S SHARE

05-Nov-24

Saab India is promoting its Gripen-E fighter jet as a contender for the IAF's MRFA tender, emphasizing its willingness to integrate Indian-made weapons and collaborate on software development to enhance compatibility with India's defense systems. The company supports the Make in India initiative, proposing to manufacture the Gripen-E in India and incorporate indigenous missiles like Astra and Rudram. Saab's readiness to work with the IAF's Aircraft & Systems Testing Establishment ensures streamlined

integration, enhancing operational flexibility. However, concerns remain regarding the provision of the source code for the radar system, a critical aspect for strategic autonomy, although Saab assures collaboration with Leonardo Aerospace for compatibility.

## Su-57 Felon Fighter Jet Criticized for Quality at Airshow China 2024 Share

The Su-57 Felon fighter jet's debut at Airshow China 2024 faced significant criticism on Chinese social media, highlighting visible construction flaws and assembly quality concerns. Users compared it unfavorably to China's Chengdu J-20, noting superior craftsmanship and design in the latter. The backlash underscores the evolving expectations for fifthgeneration fighters, with quality and precision becoming critical factors in defense procurement. As Russia aims to market the Su-57 globally, including to India, this negative reception could hinder its competitiveness, illustrating a shift in regional aerospace dynamics where China is emerging as a formidable player in advanced military technology.

## SASTRA University Unveils Indigenous Towbarless Tug for IAF Jets SHARE

SASTRA University has developed an indigenous towbarless tug designed for the Indian Air Force's (IAF) fighter jets, marking a significant advancement in ground handling equipment (GHE). This innovative solution promises to enhance efficiency and reduce environmental impact in aircraft towing. The successful testing of the Towtug underscores the university's commitment to fostering innovation and entrepreneurship through its incubation programs. This initiative not only showcases India's capabilities in defense technology but also highlights the potential for further development and scaling, strengthening the domestic defense industry and enhancing operational readiness for the IAF.

#### **Geopolitics and Security Alliances**

### G7 Allies Warn Russia Against Using North Korean Troops Share

The G7 nations and their allies have expressed deep concerns over North Korea's troop deployment to Russia, fearing these forces could be utilized in the ongoing conflict in Ukraine. They condemned the increasing military collaboration between Russia and North Korea, particularly the potential acquisition of North Korean ballistic missiles and concerns regarding the transfer of nuclear or missile technology. This situation underscores the importance of vigilance against escalating military alliances that threaten global security. For India, this scenario reinforces the need for enhanced defense collaboration with like-minded countries to ensure stability in the region amidst rising threats from unconventional alliances.

### PM Modi denounces violent attack on Hindu temple in Canada S SHARE

Prime Minister Narendra Modi condemned the recent attack on the Hindu Sabha temple in Brampton, Canada, calling it a deliberate act of violence and urging the Canadian government to uphold the rule of law and ensure justice. This incident highlights ongoing concerns regarding the safety of Indian nationals in Canada amid rising extremism linked to Khalistani separatists. Experts suggest that Modi's response marks a turning point, indicating frustration with Canadian authorities' inaction and a demand for accountability. The attack, which disrupted a consular event, has escalated tensions between India and Canada, prompting calls for stronger measures to protect places of worship and Indian diplomats abroad, underscoring India's commitment to safeguarding its citizens globally while holding foreign governments accountable for their actions.

#### India-Australia Partnership Strengthens Ahead of 2025 Milestone Share

Both leaders expressed a commitment to deepening bilateral relations ahead of the partnership's fifth anniversary in 2025, recognizing India's role as a vital economic

partner in diversifying trade and securing supply chains, showcasing the strategic alignment between the two nations in addressing contemporary global challenges.

### Canadian Hindus Protest Temple Attacks, Demand Action on Extremism S SHARE

Over a thousand Canadian Hindus protested in Brampton against rising attacks on Hindu temples by Khalistani extremists, particularly during the Diwali weekend. Prime Minister Narendra Modi condemned these attacks, urging the Canadian government to ensure the safety of Indian nationals and uphold the rule of law. The protest was organized by the Coalition of Hindus of North America, emphasizing the need for Canadian authorities to firmly address Hinduphobia and protect places of worship. The situation underlines the urgent need for Canada to address the alarming trend of religious intolerance, ensuring that all communities can practice their faith freely and safely without fear of violence.

## CDS Gen Chauhan wraps up Algeria visit to strengthen ties Share

This visit exemplifies India's strategic outreach efforts enhance partnerships with regional powers, reinforcing its role as a reliable global partner in maintaining a multipolar world order.

## Jaishankar condemns Canada temple attack, highlights extremist rise S SHARE

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar condemned recent violent incidents at a Hindu temple in Brampton, Canada, highlighting the concerning political space afforded to extremist forces in the country. The clashes, involving Khalistani protestors disrupting a consular event, have exacerbated tensions between India and Canada, particularly following allegations surrounding the killing of Canadian citizen Hardeep Singh Nijjar, designated a terrorist by India. Jaishankar emphasized the unacceptable surveillance of Indian diplomats and reiterated India's expectation for Canada to ensure justice and protect places of worship. Prime Minister Modi also condemned the attacks, affirming that such acts would not weaken India's resolve.

### Trump to Tackle Khalistani Separatism if Re-elected, Says Kumar Share

## Indian Army Resumes Patrols in Depsang, Demchok Post-Disengagement Share

The Indian Army has successfully resumed patrols in the Depsang and Demchok regions of eastern Ladakh following a disengagement agreement with China finalized on October 21, 2024. This significant development restores the military presence to pre-April 2020 conditions and aims to enhance peace along the Line of Actual Control (LAC). Indian patrols, including access to critical points like Patrolling Point 10, were conducted with prior notification to Chinese forces, reflecting adherence to agreed protocols and a commitment to prevent clashes. ## IAF MiG-29UPG Crash Near Agra: Pilot Ejects Safely After Spin Share

## India Rejects Canada's "Baseless" Cyber Espionage Claims Amid Row Share

Canada's recent National Cyber Threat Assessment 2025-2026 named India as a cyber threat adversary, marking a significant escalatory step in the diplomatic row between the two nations, particularly following

allegations of Indian involvement in the murder of Hardeep Singh Nijjar. India vehemently rejected these claims, labeling them as an unfounded attempt by Canada to manipulate global opinion against it. The Ministry of External Affairs emphasized that accusations of state-sponsored cyber espionage lack evidence and highlighted Canada's harboring of pro-Khalistani elements as a core issue. This diplomatic friction underscores the complexities of international relations, with cyber capabilities becoming a new battleground for geopolitical tensions.

## China's Navy Cautions Young Soldiers Against Online Risks S SHARE

## Four arrested, officer injured in Canada temple protest clash. S SHARE

Four individuals were arrested, and a police officer was injured during protests at a Hindu temple in Canada, linked to Khalistan supporters opposing Indian officials' presence. Videos showed violent clashes outside the Hindu Sabha Mandir in Brampton, prompting Prime Minister Modi to label the incident a deliberate attack, while Trudeau condemned the violence. The protests highlight rising tensions between India and Canada, exacerbated by previous accusations from Ottawa against India regarding Sikh activists. Both leaders emphasized the need for justice and the protection of

community rights, with Modi reaffirming India's resolve against such acts of intimidation.

## Canadian Sikh Cop Suspended for Attacking Hindu Temple S SHARE

A Canadian police officer, Harinder Sohi, was suspended after a video surfaced showing him participating in a pro-Khalistan protest outside a Hindu temple in Brampton, where anti-India slogans were chanted and violence erupted. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi condemned the attack on the temple, urging the Canadian government to ensure justice, while Canada's Minister of External Affairs expressed concern for the safety of Indian nationals. This incident highlights the rising tensions between Canada and India regarding the activities of Khalistani extremists, prompting calls for stronger action against such violence to protect communities and uphold the rule of law.

underscores the challenges of ensuring accurate representation of Indian narratives online. The government's stance aims to hold platforms accountable for content accuracy, which is vital for maintaining information integrity in a diverse and democratic society like India.

## Omar Abdullah: J&K Wouldn't Be UT If Vajpayee Were Alive SHARE

Omar Abdullah, the Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir, expressed that had former Prime Minister Atal
