Pakistan Boosts Air Power with FC-31, India Focuses on AMCA Development

Pakistan is accelerating the induction of China's FC-31 (the export variant of the J-35A) stealth fighter into its air force, having already dispatched pilots for training. This delayed but upgraded twin-engine fifth-generation jet, branded the "Gyrfalcon," is expected to arrive in batches over the next 12–18 months and will likely be armed with PL-17 missiles capable of striking targets up to 400km away. Pakistan already operates Chinese J-10C and JF-17s, and this acquisition is viewed as a strategic move to strengthen its air capabilities relative to India. Meanwhile, India is making significant strides in its indigenous aerospace program—its Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA) initiative, officially launched in late May 2025, has entered the execution phase with plans to build five prototypes by 2035. The government has opened the AMCA project to private sector participation, reinforcing 'Make in India' goals, while other home-grown platforms such as the LCA Mark II are expected to enter production by 2029. At the same time, the Indian Air Force continues to modernize with Rafale and Su-30 MKI fighters and is adding new systems like directed-energy weapons and AESA radars. Though the FC-31 offers Pakistan a step up in stealth capability, India's robust multi-platform fleet, ongoing modernization, strong domestic production, and future 5th-generation capabilities position it to maintain regional air superiority. Ultimately, while the FC-31 represents a noteworthy upgrade for Pakistan, India's established air defense systems and ongoing

development will shape future air power dynamics in South Asia

BluGlass Secures First \$230K Order from Indian Defence Ministry

BluGlass Inc, a US-based semiconductor company, has received its first order worth \$230,000 from the Indian Ministry of Defence, marking its acceptance as an approved supplier. The order involves development services for gallium nitride (GaN) laser diodes, crucial for advanced applications in LiDAR, communications, and military countermeasures. This partnership highlights India's strategic efforts to enhance its technological capabilities in defense and positions it as a significant player in the global semiconductor market. With GaN technology known for its superior performance, this collaboration underscores India's commitment to integrating cutting-edge technologies to bolster national security and advance its defense industry.

IAF's IL-76 to be Transformed into Kaveri Engine Test Bed

Recent developments in India's indigenous aerospace capabilities center on the proposal to convert an IAF Ilyushin IL-76 into a Flying Test Bed for the Kaveri Derivative Engine (KDE) and the Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA) program. This initiative, driven by the Gas Turbine Research Establishment (GTRE) under DRDO, aims to enhance self-reliance in jet engine technology and reduce dependency on foreign testing facilities, specifically Russia's Gromov Institute. As the Kaveri engine program, initiated in the 1980s, has delivered critical learnings despite facing challenges, experts emphasize the necessity for a next-generation

engine, tentatively named Kaveri 2.0, to meet the thrust requirements for the AMCA and Tejas Mk2. Two strategic paths for developing Kaveri 2.0 have been proposed: fully indigenous development, fostering complete ownership and long-term autonomy, or collaboration with established global OEMs like Safran, which could expedite production and enhance domestic capabilities through technology transfer. This decision is pivotal as it addresses India's urgent need for advanced engines amidst regional security threats from adversaries like China and Pakistan, ultimately shaping India's future air combat capabilities and defense industry landscape.

Tata to Manufacture Rafale Fuselages in Hyderabad, Boosting Defense Indigenization

Tata Advanced Systems has entered into an agreement with Dassault Aviation to manufacture Rafale fighter jet fuselages in Hyderabad, enhancing India's aerospace capabilities. The new facility will produce parts for global orders and is expected to deliver its first units by FY28, with potential for over 200 fuselages if India increases its Rafale orders. This initiative reflects India's commitment to indigenization in defense manufacturing, with 60% of Rafale's production value anticipated to occur in India. The partnership also underscores a significant transfer of technology and production capabilities, positioning India as a key player in the global aerospace sector.

BEL Modernizes THD-1955 Radar System to Boost India's Defense Capability

BEL has successfully completed a technological upgrade of the THD-1955 radar system, originally designed in France and in service since the 1970s, enhancing its operational lifespan by 10 to 15 years. The upgrade, now called THD 2.0, features indigenously developed digitised components, improving surveillance capabilities and situational awareness while aligning with the "Atmanirbhar Bharat" initiative by reducing dependence on foreign technology. This modernization not only bolsters the Indian Air Force's air defense network but also showcases India's growing technological capabilities and commitment to self-reliance in defense, setting a precedent for future projects. Overall, this achievement exemplifies India's capacity to revitalize legacy systems through indigenous innovation.

Taiwan Requests India's D4 Anti-Drone System to Combat China

Taiwan has formally requested India's indigenously developed D4 anti-drone system to bolster its defenses against escalating Chinese drone incursions. Developed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and manufactured by Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL) and Zen Technologies, the D4 system has proven its effectiveness in neutralizing various drone threats. The system employs a dual-layered defense mechanism: "soft kill" techniques, including radio frequency jamming and GPS spoofing, disrupt drone communications and navigation, while "hard kill" methods utilize laser-directed energy weapons to physically destroy hostile drones. The D4 system integrates radar, radio-frequency detectors, and electro-optical/infrared sensors to detect and track drones up to 4 kilometers away, providing comprehensive situational awareness. Its successful deployment during Operation Sindoor, where it neutralized Turkish-origin drones and loitering munitions used by Pakistan, has garnered international attention. Taiwan's interest in acquiring the D4 system underscores a potential shift in India's defense diplomacy, reflecting its growing role in regional security dynamics and the Indo-Pacific's strategic landscape. Expanding defense ties with Taiwan not only enhances India's defense exports but also positions it as a key player in countering Chinese aggression in the region.

L&T Defence Advocates National Consortium for AMCA Fighter Development

L&T Defence's Executive VP Arun Ramchandani has proposed a National Consortium model for India's Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA) program, emphasizing its alignment with the Aatmanirbhar Bharat initiative. This approach aims to harness the strengths of both public and private sectors to expedite the development of India's fifth-generation stealth fighter, addressing the Indian Air Force's critical need for advanced combat platforms amid declining squadron strength. The model encourages competitive bidding among firms like L&T, Tata, and Adani, potentially mitigating risks and optimizing costs. With plans to develop five prototypes by 2031 and initiate series production by 2035, the AMCA project represents a significant step toward enhancing India's air combat capabilities.

IAF's S-400 Achieves Record Kill, Establishes 200 km No-Fly Zone SHARE

The Indian Air Force (IAF) made history by utilizing its S-400 air defense system to shoot down a Pakistan Air Force (PAF) Saab Erieye aircraft at an unprecedented range of 280-300 km, establishing a 200 km no-fly zone along the International Border. This operation not only showcases the S-400's capabilities but also significantly hampers PAF's aerial surveillance and coordination efforts. With the IAF operating three S-400 regiments and more to come, India's air defense posture is rapidly strengthening, compelling the PAF to rethink its operational strategies in response to the loss of critical assets. This development reinforces India's dominance in regional air defense and enhances its strategic deterrence.

Zen Technologies Set to Secure More Anti-Drone Orders from India SHARE

Zen Technologies, a prominent Indian defense technology firm, is set to receive additional orders for its advanced Counter-Unmanned Aerial Systems (C-UAS) from the Indian Armed Forces, following their successful neutralization of a Turkish-made drone during a recent conflict. This development highlights India's commitment to self-reliance in defense manufacturing under the Make in India initiative, emphasizing the importance of indigenous technologies in countering the growing UAV threat. The C-UAS integrates sophisticated radar and electronic warfare capabilities, reinforcing the operational readiness of the Indian military while reducing reliance on foreign suppliers. Zen Technologies' innovations not only enhance India's strategic autonomy but also position the nation as a significant player in the global defense landscape.

Indian Army Seeks 4,000 Anti-Tank Mines to Boost Self-Reliance SHARE

The Indian Army has issued an RFI for 4,000 Top Attack anti-tank mines under the DAP-2020 plan, with a clear emphasis on homegrown production and bolstering its counter-armour capabilities amid regional security pressures. Designed to breach the vulnerable top armour of enemy vehicles, these mines form part of the broader Make-in-India and Aatmanirbhar Bharat defense strategy, aimed at reducing reliance on foreign munitions. Alongside proven players like Bharat Dynamics Limited and Tata Advanced Systems, several

Indian firms are emerging in the mine and related ordnance sector. Bharat Forge, for instance, is a major manufacturer of artillery and armoured vehicles and is well-positioned to expand into mine systems; Godrej & Boyce recently secured licensing from DRDO to produce a self-propelled mechanical mine-layer; Economic Explosives Ltd in Nagpur has expertise in manufacturing industrial and defence-grade explosives; and private-sector entities such as Mahindra Telephonics, Tejas Strategic Technologies, and Punj Lloyd have capabilities in defence manufacturing that could be leveraged. This procurement thus not only enhances the Indian Army's readiness but also stimulates a more resilient domestic defense-industrial ecosystem, empowering both public sector units and private enterprises to innovate, scale, and gradually phase out dependence on imports.

U.S. Set to Offer India F-35A Jets to Strengthen Air Power Against China and Pakistan SHARE

The U.S. is set to formally propose the sale of F-35A stealth fighters to India by June 2025, enhancing India's air power amid rising threats from China's J-20 and Pakistan's J-35 jets. This potential government-to-government deal could allow deliveries to start by late 2027, providing a timely solution to India's dwindling fighter fleet. However, it may sidestep India's "Make in India" initiative, raising concerns over technology transfer and operational independence, especially given India's existing ties with Russia. Nonetheless, the F-35's advanced capabilities and U.S. strategic alignment with India present a compelling case for bolstering India's defense capabilities in the Indo-Pacific region.

Defense Policy and Budgeting

Defence Minister to Address GST on R&D Grants for Private Firms SHARE

The Indian Defence Minister is set to discuss the 18% GST imposed on R&D grants for private defence firms with the Finance Minister, following concerns that this tax hinders innovation and contradicts the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative. While public sector entities are exempt from this GST, private MSMEs and startups have been burdened, risking financial strain and stalling technological advancements. The Defence Ministry acknowledges the importance of private participation in defense R&D, and there is growing consensus for policy

reform to reclassify these grants as exempt, ensuring a supportive environment for innovation. A resolution is anticipated as both ministries are actively considering the issue.

Geopolitics and Security Alliances

India's Diplomatic Push Against Pakistan's Terrorism Nexus

RBI Governor: India-Pak Conflict Minimal Impact on Economy SHARE

This reflects the resilience of the Indian economy in the face of military engagements, showcasing the effectiveness of strategic defense operations in safeguarding national interests.

Tharoor: China's Role in India-Pakistan Tensions Is Crucial SHARE

Congress leader Shashi Tharoor has highlighted China as a significant factor in the ongoing tensions between India and Pakistan, particularly noting Pakistan's heavy reliance on Chinese military support and the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor. Military Operations

IAF Apache Helicopter Safely Makes Precautionary Landing in UP SHARE

On June 6, 2025, an Indian Air Force Apache AH-64 attack helicopter safely executed a precautionary landing near Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh, during a routine training sortie. According to IAF officials, the decision to land was proactive, prompted by crew observations rather than an in-flight emergency. Emphasizing the strength of their safety protocols, the Air Force ensured both the aircraft and its personnel remained unharmed. A ground support team promptly reached the scene to assess and, if needed, rectify any minor technical issues. The incident underscores the IAF's commitment to operational readiness and pilot safety, highlighting

their vigilance and capacity to manage precautionary procedures smoothly without risk to lives or property.

Northern Army Commander Reviews Operational Readiness in Mathura

Northern Army Commander Lt Gen Pratik Sharma recently visited the Strike One Corps in Mathura, Uttar Pradesh, where he reviewed the formation's operational preparedness and praised their dedication and innovative approach. He also assessed a Transit Camp in Jammu and the Udhampur Air Force Station, commending their commitment to maintaining high morale and providing seamless operational support. Furthermore, his visit to Basantgarh, an area with a history of terrorism, underscored the Army's focus on vigilance and tactical readiness in combating threats. This proactive engagement reflects India's commitment to ensuring national security and operational excellence in challenging terrains.

Modi Slams Pakistan Over Kashmir, Praises Operation Sindoor Success

Prime Minister Narendra Modi recently inaugurated significant infrastructure projects in Jammu and Kashmir, including the world's highest railway bridge over the Chenab River and India's first cable-stayed Anji bridge, while condemning Pakistan for its attempts to undermine tourism and the livelihoods of local Kashmiris through terrorist attacks. Modi accused Pakistan of targeting tourists in Pahalgam to incite communal unrest and destroy the economic well-being of the region's residents, emphasizing the strategic importance of tourism as a lifeline for local employment. He highlighted the success of Operation Sindoor, asserting that it dealt a decisive blow to Pakistan-based terrorists, and vowed that the Indian Armed Forces would continue to protect Kashmir's peace and prosperity. Modi announced additional financial assistance for residents affected by Pakistani shelling, underscoring India's commitment to support those impacted by cross-border violence. The Prime Minister reiterated the objective of making India a leading defense exporter, which aligns with the country's push for self-reliance in defense manufacturing. This approach not only enhances India's military capabilities but also aims to bolster employment opportunities within the defense sector, ultimately fostering regional stability and economic growth in Jammu and Kashmir.

New Evidence Suggests IAF Precision Strikes Severely Crippled Pak Airbases and Assets

In early May, the Indian Air Force launched deep strikes on Pakistan (Operation Sindoor) hitting at least eleven Pakistani air bases including Bholari and Sukkur. Recent satellite imagery and official assessments reveal significant damage. At Bholari, a BrahMos missile blew a roughly 60-foot-wide crater through a hangar roof, destroying the Saab 2000 AWACS airborne radar plane inside – a loss later confirmed by Pakistan's former Air Marshal Masood Akhtar. Pakistan's own figures list Squadron Leader Usman Yousaf and four other airmen killed at Bholari, though some analysts suggest the toll was far higher. Sukkur Air Base likewise suffered major hits: photos show a collapsed aircraft shelter and a destroyed adjacent radar installation. Other bases were similarly battered: Jacobabad's Shahbaz base lost a large hangar and took damage to its control tower, and the Mushaf (Sargodha) airfield had multiple deep craters blasted into its runway (which has since been patched). The civilian Sheikh Zayed Airport at Rahim Yar Khan also shows a patched-over missile crater on its runway, previously forcing flight suspensions. The strikes reportedly destroyed at least six Pakistani fighter jets (including F-16s and JF-17s) and two surveillance planes, along with over a dozen armed drones – one strike alone incinerated an entire hangar full of Chinese-made Wing Loong UAVs. Even a C-130 Hercules transport aircraft parked at a forward field was blown up. Radar and technical facilities at bases such as Pasrur, Chunian, Murid and Chaklala (Nur Khan) were wrecked, degrading Pakistan's air defense network. Analysts estimate these raids knocked out roughly one-fifth of the Pakistan Air Force's infrastructure. While Pakistan's military initially claimed most incoming missiles were intercepted and reported only minor damage, the accumulating evidence of destroyed hangars, radars, runways and aircraft suggests that India's precision strikes inflicted a far deeper blow to Pakistan's air capabilities than Islamabad publicly admitted.

US Military Drills Boost Crisis Response in East Asia

The U.S. military's recent logistics drills in East Asia are aimed at enhancing coordination and communication with allies amidst growing Chinese assertiveness in the region. TRANSCOM Commander Randall Reed emphasized the importance of these exercises to test

logistics capabilities and ensure a swift U.S. response to crises. The ongoing collaboration among U.S. allies, including Japan, the Philippines, and South Korea, strengthens regional security and promotes interoperability, as evidenced by joint naval operations in the South China Sea. This proactive approach underlines the U.S. commitment to maintaining peace and stability in a geopolitically sensitive area, which is crucial for India's strategic interests in the Indo-Pacific.

Russian missile and drone strikes injure three, damage Kyiv areas

A recent Russian missile and drone attack on Ukraine wounded at least three people and caused significant damage across several districts, including Kyiv. As air defense systems worked to intercept the threats, falling debris led to fires in residential areas and damage to metro tracks. Local officials emphasized the urgency of seeking shelter, highlighting the ongoing humanitarian challenges in the region. The situation escalated further as U.S. President Donald Trump suggested allowing the conflict to continue before pursuing peace, a stance that diverges from previous calls for immediate resolution, underscoring the complexities of international diplomacy in the face of ongoing aggression.

Security forces clash with militants near Arunachal-Myanmar border

An encounter occurred between security forces and militants in Longding district, Arunachal Pradesh, near the Myanmar border, following intelligence on militant movements. The security forces faced heavy fire but successfully retaliated, causing the militants to retreat across the border. A previous encounter in Manipur resulted in the neutralization of 10 militants linked to cross-border insurgency, along with the recovery of a substantial cache of weapons. The Indian security forces are maintaining heightened surveillance and a robust posture along the 1,643-km border with Myanmar, coordinating effectively with civil administration and intelligence to ensure regional stability and security.

PAF Looks to Turkey for Replacement Control Centers After IAF Strikes

impairing Pakistan's air defense infrastructure. Notably, two Next Gen Mobile Mission Control Centres (NG-MMCCs) at PAF Base Nur Khan were destroyed, crippling the PAF's command and control capabilities. These mobile centers, developed in collaboration with Turkey, were vital for battlefield coordination. In response, a delegation from the PAF's National Aerospace Science and Technology Park (NASTP) is set to visit Turkey to explore options for replacing the lost NG-MMCCs, highlighting Pakistan's reliance on foreign partnerships for military reconstruction. The IAF's strikes also targeted other key PAF bases, including Bholari, Murid, and Sargodha, resulting in the destruction of high-value assets such as AWACS aircraft and UAV command facilities. The operation, which followed a terrorist attack in Indian Kashmir, demonstrated India's enhanced military capabilities and strategic precision, effectively setting back Pakistan's air force by an estimated five years. The conflict concluded with a ceasefire on May 10, brokered by international diplomacy, but underscored the escalating tensions and the critical role of advanced military technology and alliances in regional security dynamics.

DRDO Accelerates BMD Phase-II to Counter Pakistan's Missile Threats

The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) is expediting the development of its Phase-II Ballistic Missile Defence (BMD) system to address the evolving missile threats from Pakistan. This advanced system aims to intercept ballistic missiles with ranges up to 5,000 km, enhancing India's capability to protect major urban centers and strategic assets. A significant milestone was achieved on July 24, 2024, when DRDO successfully conducted a flight test of the Phase-II BMD system. The test involved the launch of an endo-atmospheric interceptor missile, which effectively neutralized a target simulating a hostile ballistic missile. This demonstration validated the integrated network-centric warfare system, comprising long-range sensors, low-latency communication networks, and advanced interceptor missiles. The urgency in advancing the BMD Phase-II program is driven by concerns over Pakistan's development of longer-range and more sophisticated ballistic missiles, such as the Shaheen series. India's existing air defense systems, including the Akash and Medium-Range Surface-to-Air Missile (MR-SAM), have proven effective against short-range threats. However, the Phase-II BMD system is essential to counter medium and intermediate-range ballistic missiles, ensuring a robust multi-layered defense architecture. This strategic initiative

underscores India's commitment to bolstering its defense capabilities and maintaining a technological edge in the region.

Her primary motive was to meet Zulfikar, a Pakistani national she had connected with on social media. After being detained by Pakistani authorities for nine days, she was repatriated to India.

Maoist leader with Rs 40 lakh bounty killed in Chhattisgarh clash.

A senior Maoist leader with a bounty of Rs 40 lakh was killed in an encounter with security forces in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district. The operation, part of an anti-Naxalite initiative, involved multiple units including the Special Task Force and CoBRA. This encounter follows the recent death of CPI (Maoist) general secretary Nambala Keshav Rao, marking a significant setback for the Maoist movement. The successful operation showcases the effectiveness of India's security forces in countering insurgency and highlights their commitment to maintaining law and order in challenging regions like Bastar. Ongoing search operations indicate a proactive approach in tackling remaining threats in the area.

Tharoor: India's Fight Is Against Terrorism, Not Pakistan

Congress MP Shashi Tharoor emphasized that India's military responses are focused on dismantling terrorist bases in Pakistan, rather than harming civilians, as a reaction to Pakistan's failure to address terrorism emanating from its territory. He articulated the asymmetry in the India-Pakistan conflict, where India targets terror infrastructure while Pakistan often retaliates against civilian populations. Tharoor warned Pakistan against underestimating India's patience, stating that any further acts of terrorism would provoke a strong response. He highlighted the collaboration between Indian political parties in addressing terrorism and discussed India's Operation Sindoor, which targeted over 100 militants linked to groups like Jaish-e-Mohammed in retaliation for the recent Pahalgam terror attack. Tharoor also pointed out China's significant military support to Pakistan, reinforcing the geopolitical complexities of the region while maintaining India's commitment to dialogue contingent upon Pakistan's actions against terrorism. Overall, Tharoor's remarks reflect a decisive Indian stance against terrorism, emphasizing national security while advocating for peaceful development, and reiterating

on May 23 via the Attari-Wagah border. The Punjab Police registered a zero FIR under the Official Secrets Act due to the sensitive nature of her unauthorized border crossing and initial custody, before transferring the case to Nagpur's Kapil Nagar police station. Investigations revealed spyware-like applications on her phone and communications with at least two Pakistani nationals, raising concerns about potential espionage. The Kargil police, who initiated a search operation using drones and sniffer dogs, are seeking her custody to reconstruct her route, but legal proceedings have been delayed due to the absence of a physical production warrant. The National Investigation Agency (NIA) is monitoring the case, and forensic analysis of her phone is underway to determine the purpose and origin of the suspicious applications.

2024 Sees Over 1,000 Hoax Bomb Threats in Indian Aviation [SHARE](#)

In 2024, India experienced a significant surge in hoax bomb threats against its aviation sector, with incidents increasing over 300 times compared to the previous six years. A total of 1,019 threats were recorded, predominantly via the social media platform X, with October alone accounting for 687 threats. The alarming rise in such threats poses challenges for national security and public safety, highlighting the need for enhanced vigilance and countermeasures within the Indian civil aviation framework. This situation underscores the importance of robust cybersecurity and response mechanisms to mitigate the risks associated with malicious communications in the aviation sector.

Cybersecurity and Information Warfare

Social Media Slip Leads to Destruction of Pakistan's HQ-9 Unit [SHARE](#)

Renowned military historian Tom Cooper revealed that a social media blunder by a Pakistani Air Defence officer led to the destruction of a Chinese-made HQ-9 air defense unit during India's Operation Sindoor in May 2025. The officer's post inadvertently disclosed the unit's location, allowing Indian forces to execute a precision drone strike, significantly weakening Pakistan's air defense capabilities. This incident underscores the vulnerabilities in Pakistan's operational security, particularly in the digital era, where social media can expose critical military assets. As India

continues to enhance its intelligence and strike capabilities, Pakistan's reliance on foreign systems and lack of discipline may increasingly hinder its defense efficacy.

Participants will conduct interactive sessions with NCC cadets and honor war veterans, thereby enhancing the socio-economic landscape of remote regions. This mission, in collaboration with Hero MotoCorp, underscores the Indian military's commitment to social outreach and the empowerment of women in leadership roles within the forces.

Starlink Secures Key Licence to Launch Satellite Internet Services in India



06-Jun-2025

Elon Musk's Starlink has received a crucial Global Mobile Personal Communication by Satellite (GMPCS) licence from India's Department of Telecommunications, marking a significant step toward launching its satellite internet services in the country. This approval positions Starlink as the third entity, following Eutelsat's OneWeb and Reliance Jio, to receive such a licence in India. The company aims to provide high-speed internet, particularly targeting underserved rural and remote regions where over 40% of the population lacks connectivity. To commence operations, Starlink must still obtain additional clearances from India's space regulator, acquire spectrum, establish ground infrastructure, and pass stringent security testing, processes expected to take

several months. In March, Starlink signed agreements with Indian telecom giants Reliance Jio and Bharti Airtel to retail its equipment, even as these companies compete in the broadband market. India's telecom regulator has proposed a 4% annual revenue fee for satellite providers, a move criticized by domestic firms as too lenient. The Indian government's alignment with Musk's view that satellite spectrum should be assigned rather than auctioned has further facilitated Starlink's entry. With the satellite internet market projected to reach \$1.9 billion by 2030, Starlink's entry intensifies competition, especially as Amazon's Kuiper awaits approval.

US VP Vance Backs India's Response to Pahalgam Attack, Says Tharoor

A recent meeting between US Vice President Vance and an Indian delegation, led by Shashi Tharoor, showcased strong US support for India's military response to the April 2025 Pahalgam attack, which resulted in 26 fatalities. Vance expressed respect for India's right to respond and shared intelligence on threats from Pakistan, reinforcing bilateral cooperation in counter-terrorism and technology, including AI. The Indian delegation emphasized Operation Sindoor, which effectively eliminated over 100 terrorists, and aimed to rally international backing against Pakistan-sponsored terrorism. This meeting underscored a productive dialogue and a commitment to strengthening the India-US strategic partnership amidst ongoing security challenges in the region.

Arunachal Pradesh launches task forces to tackle illegal immigration.

The Arunachal Pradesh government has initiated a statewide effort to detect and deport illegal Bangladeshi immigrants, following directives from the Union Ministry of Home Affairs. Each district will form a task force to enforce the Inner Line Permit regulations and identify undocumented individuals, with a strict 30-day deadline set for verification. The Department of Border Security Force and Assam Rifles will also assist in border management. This crackdown underscores India's commitment to securing its borders and managing immigration effectively, reflecting a proactive approach to national security and the rule of law. The focus on ILP compliance highlights the regional significance of immigration control for Arunachal Pradesh.

Severe floods in Manipur affect 1.65 lakh, prompt rescue efforts.

Over 1.65 lakh people have been affected by severe flooding in Manipur, damaging 35,384 houses and leading to one fatality, as torrential rains caused river overflow and embankment breaches.
