### India to Receive INS Tamal, Second Talwar-Class Frigate Soon S SHARE

06-May-25

India is set to receive INS Tamal, the second of four Talwar-class stealth frigates under a 2016 Indo-Russian defense agreement, with its arrival expected by May 28. Constructed at Russia's Yantar Shipyard, Tamal showcases advanced capabilities including supersonic BrahMos missiles, anti-submarine systems, and stealth technology, enhancing the Indian Navy's operational effectiveness amid rising regional tensions. With the first frigate, INS Tushil, already inducted, the delivery of Tamal reinforces India's naval collaboration with Russia, while also diversifying its defense partnerships. The strategic timing of this transfer, coinciding with diplomatic solidarity against terrorism, underscores the importance of such military assets in bolstering India's maritime security and power projection in the Indo-Pacific and Indian Ocean regions.

### Indian Navy and DRDO Successfully Test Indigenous Ground Mine S SHARE

06-May-25

The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and the Indian Navy have successfully conducted combat firing of the indigenous Multi-Influence Ground Mine (MIGM), enhancing the Navy's capabilities against stealth ships and submarines. Developed by the Naval Science & Technological Laboratory in collaboration with various DRDO entities, this advanced underwater mine represents a significant step forward in undersea warfare. With production

backed by Bharat Dynamics Limited and Apollo Microsystems Limited, the system is now poised for induction into the Indian Navy, as affirmed by Raksha Mantri Shri Rajnath Singh and DRDO Chairman Dr. Samir V Kamat, highlighting India's commitment to bolstering its defense capabilities through indigenous innovation.

### Indian Army Boosts Air Defense with VSHORADS-NG Acquisition SHARE

India is enhancing its air defence capabilities with the acquisition of indigenous VSHORADS-NG to replace aging Igla-1M systems while concurrently receiving Russian Igla-S missiles for immediate deployment along its western border amid rising tensions with Pakistan. The VSHORADS-NG, developed by DRDO and Indian partners, reflects India's commitment to selfreliance under the 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' initiative, aiming for long-term operational readiness against aerial threats. Meanwhile, the rapid deployment of Igla-S systems underscores a proactive military strategy in response to regional security challenges, particularly following the Pahalgam terror attack. This dual approach of integrating foreign acquisitions and fosterina domestic technological advancements positions India strategically to address immediate threats while ensuring future self-sufficiency in defense capabilities, enhancing its deterrent posture in a complex security environment.

## India Plans 6th-Gen Fighter by 2040, Doubling AMCA Capabilities Share

India's Air Force has embarked on ambitious plans for a 6th-generation fighter jet, targeting a prototype by 2040 to replace the aging Su-30MKI fleet. Key enhancements include double the range and payload of the upcoming AMCA fighter, with a focus on advanced technologies such as AI, directed-energy weapons, and adaptive stealth. This strategic move responds to the evolving threat landscape, particularly from China's J-20, and aims to maintain India's air superiority amid rising global military modernization. The initiative not only reinforces deterrence but also highlights India's commitment to advancing its aerospace capabilities in the competitive global defense arena.

### IMDEX Asia 2025: Highlighting Naval Power and Tech Innovation Share

IMDEX Asia 2025, Asia's premier naval and maritime defense event, will take place from May 6-8, 2025, in Singapore, emphasizing technological advancements like AI and uncrewed systems. Expected to attract over 12,500 attendees and 230 companies from 26 countries, the event will feature 17 warships, highlighting international naval cooperation. The exhibition includes a dedicated Uncrewed Systems Zone and a startup launchpad, fostering innovation and engagement. With strong participation from industry leaders and countries, IMDEX Asia reinforces its role as a critical platform for enhancing maritime security and collaboration in the Asia-Pacific region, pivotal for India's defense strategies and regional stability.

### ideaForge Gains DGCA Nod for Drone Pilot Training Program S SHARE

ideaForge Technology Limited has received DGCA certification to conduct its Remote Pilot Certificate Training (Small Class) program, aiming to enhance India's drone workforce through a structured five-day training initiative that includes both classroom instruction and practical flying sessions. This program not only aligns with the government's vision of making India a global drone hub by 2030 but also supports the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative by reducing dependency on foreign operators and creating local opportunities across various sectors. With plans to train 200-250 pilots annually, ideaForge's efforts significantly contribute to developing indigenous talent and operational expertise in the expanding UAV sector, reinforcing the country's journey toward self-reliance in emerging technologies.

### Pakistan Secures Range-Capped PL-15E Missiles from China Share

A leaked document from China's CATIC reveals that Pakistan has received 240 PL-15E missiles with a capped range of 145 kilometers, contradicting claims of acquiring the more capable PL-15 with a range exceeding 200 kilometers. This supply also includes 20 J-10CE fighter jets and is part of a broader \$1.4 billion defense deal, emphasizing the deepening China-Pakistan defense ties. The restricted capabilities of the PL-15E highlight intentional limitations imposed by China, raising questions about the PAF's air-to-air combat advancements. This situation underscores the strategic balance in the region, where India must remain vigilant to counter any perceived threats from enhanced Sino-Pakistani military capabilities.

## Indian Army to Boost Troop Safety with New Light Specialist Vehicles Share

The Indian Ministry of Defence is set to acquire a significant number of Light Specialist Vehicles (LSVs) to enhance troop mobility and safety along its northern borders, particularly in challenging high-altitude regions like Ladakh. This initiative, initiated through a Request for Information (RFI), highlights the need for lightweight, agile vehicles that provide protection against small arms fire, crucial for operations amid ongoing border tensions. The LSVs will support rapid deployment and reconnaissance missions, reflecting India's commitment to modernizing its armed forces and ensuring operational effectiveness in strategically critical areas. Furthermore, indigenous manufacturing efforts, like the Mahindra ALSV, underscore the urgency and self-reliance in defense capabilities.

### Can Pakistan's SH-15 Howitzer Match India's K-9 Vajra? SHARE

As tensions along the Line of Control escalate, Pakistan's deployment of the Chinese SH-15 howitzers aims to counter India's K-9 Vajra artillery. While the SH-15 boasts a range of 53 kilometers and a fire rate of 4-6 rounds per minute, the K-9 Vajra, with its superior range of 50-52 kilometers and fire rate of 6-8 rounds per minute, remains more versatile and battle-proven. Indian experts assert that the K-9's advanced targeting systems and mobility in rugged terrain provide a significant tactical advantage, ensuring India's artillery capabilities remain formidable despite Pakistan's military upgrades. India's ongoing modernization plans

further solidify this edge over Pakistan's reliance on Chinese technology, which raises questions about its effectiveness and reliability.

## Four Indian Tech Firms Compete for AMCA Airframe Design Contract S SHARE

Four Indian tech firms-Infosys, TCS, L&T Technology Services, and Cyient-have successfully cleared the technical evaluation phase for the airframe design of India's Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA), a fifth-generation stealth fighter. This marks a significant shift in India's defense landscape by incorporating private sector expertise alongside traditional public sector undertakings like HAL. While concerns exist regarding these firms' limited experience in defense manufacturing, their advanced capabilities in digital transformation, engineering, and lifecycle management are expected to meet rigorous program standards. The **AMCA** program is vital for India's defense modernization, with the next bidding phase set to determine the leading design contractor.

### DRDO Unveils Advanced SDR to Boost Communication in Fighter Jets Share

The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has developed an advanced indigenous Software Defined Radio (SDR) system to replace the Israeli-supplied BNET SDR in Indian fighter jets, enhancing self-reliance in defense technology. This SDR, available in two variants, supports diverse operational needs and is designed for seamless integration into various platforms, including Sukhoi Su-30 MKI and MiG-29. By replacing the BNET, India aims to reduce dependence on foreign technology and bolster national security amidst modernization efforts. The indigenous SDR will improve communication systems, crucial for operations in contested environments, demonstrating India's commitment to advancing its defense capabilities and ensuring operational autonomy.

### Comparing Indian Navy's Rafale-M to IAF's Rafale Fleet S SHARE

India's defense capabilities have been significantly enhanced by the procurement of 26 Rafale-Marine (Rafale-M) aircraft for the Indian Navy, complementing the existing fleet of 36 Rafale jets in the Indian Air Force (IAF). The Rafale-M is specifically designed for carrier operations with features like reinforced landing gear

and a tailored radar system, making it adept at maritime combat. This acquisition, valued at ?63,000 crore, not only strengthens naval air operations but also promotes synergy with the IAF, vital for countering regional threats, particularly from China's naval expansion. However, it highlights India's ongoing reliance on foreign platforms until indigenous solutions like the Twin-Engine Deck-Based Fighter become operational.

### **Defense Policy and Budgeting**

## Pakistan Boosts Defense Budget by 18% Amidst Tensions with India Share

Pakistan plans to increase its defense spending by 18% to over Rs 2.5 trillion in response to rising tensions with India, particularly following a terrorist attack that claimed 26 lives. The decision, supported by the Pakistan Peoples Party and the ruling Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz, highlights a consensus on enhancing defense capabilities amidst current security threats. Concurrently, Pakistan has conducted successful missile tests, underscoring its intent to bolster military preparedness. This escalation in defense expenditure reflects Pakistan's strategic priorities and concerns about India's military posture, while India remains resolute in its defensive measures, including punitive actions against cross-border terrorism.

### **Geopolitics and Security Alliances**

### India's Indus Treaty Suspension Sparks 21% Water Shortage in Pakistan Share

India's decision to put the Indus Waters Treaty in abeyance has resulted in an anticipated 21% water shortage for Pakistan during the Kharif season, raising alarms among its authorities. The Indus River System Authority noted a significant reduction in River Chenab inflows, attributed to India's closure of dam gates, which locals support, emphasizing their solidarity with the Indian Army and Prime Minister Modi. This action follows a terrorist attack in Pahalgam linked to Pakistan, reinforcing India's stance on using water as a strategic leverage against cross-border terrorism. Overall, India's approach underscores a firm response to security threats while highlighting the geopolitical

complexities surrounding water resources in South Asia.

## Rajnath Singh Thanks Japan for Support, Strengthens Defense Ties SHARE

India's Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar recently engaged in significant discussions with their Japanese counterparts to strengthen bilateral ties, especially in light of the recent Pahalgam terrorist attack. Singh expressed gratitude for Japan's swift support and emphasized the importance of their strategic partnership, which includes agreements on defense collaboration and technology exchanges. Both ministers focused enhancing military on interoperability, expanding joint development efforts, and fostering deeper economic ties through talent exchanges and technology partnerships. Additionally, Jaishankar highlighted Japan's vital role in attracting investments to India, particularly in Assam's semiconductor sector. These diplomatic engagements underscore the shared commitment to counterterrorism and regional security, reinforcing the Indo-Japan alliance as a critical pillar in promoting peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific region.

### Israeli Minister Advocates for Total Gaza Destruction Amid War

Israeli Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich has made controversial statements indicating that a decisive victory over Hamas would result in the complete destruction of the Gaza Strip, with civilians relocated to humanitarian zones and eventually migrating to third countries. This statement reflects the increasing calls within Israel for the annexation of the West Bank, a territory occupied since 1967, which Smotrich labeled as a significant challenge for the current government. Concurrently, the Israeli military has mobilized tens of thousands of reservists for a planned offensive in Gaza, with reports indicating that over 75 percent of reservists have responded voluntarily to the call-up. Israel's military capabilities are formidable, with 169,500 active soldiers and 465,000 reservists, as well as 12 ground divisions, a robust air force with 316 combat aircraft, and a naval fleet that includes submarines and corvettes. Since the onset of the conflict triggered by Hamas's attack on October 7, 2023, Israel has engaged on multiple fronts, including the West Bank, Lebanon, Syria, and against Iranian threats, and has conducted numerous air strikes in these regions. Experts assert that there is currently no shortage of personnel, indicating that the army is well-prepared for operations in Gaza and other theaters, even while maintaining positions against threats from Hezbollah and retaliating against missile attacks from Yemen's Houthi rebels. Smotrich's comments and the military mobilization demonstrate Israel's strategic approach amidst ongoing hostilities and underline the complex geopolitical dynamics at play in the region.

### India Regulates Chenab River Flow Amid Rising Tensions with Pakistan Share

India has taken significant measures in response to the Pahalgam terror attack, which resulted in the loss of 26 lives, predominantly among tourists. In an act reflecting its strategic posture, India has suspended the Indus Water Treaty (IWT) with Pakistan and regulated water flow from the Baglihar and Salal dams on the Chenab River, leading to a notable drop in water levels. This maneuver not only underscores India's capability to control water resources but also serves as a strategic pressure point against Pakistan, which heavily relies on the Indus River system for its agriculture and overall water supply. The restriction is expected to create a 21% water shortage during Pakistan's early Kharif season, impacting agricultural outputs and potentially exacerbating domestic unrest within Pakistan due to rising food inflation and dwindling crop yields. Locals in India have shown support for this decision, emphasizing a nationalistic sentiment against providing water to Pakistan. Furthermore, this water regulation is poised to create additional challenges for Pakistan's agricultural sector, which accounts for a significant portion of its economy and rural livelihood. With the suspension of the IWT, Pakistan faces a compounded water crisis, given its already limited storage capacity and ongoing water management issues, suggesting that India's current actions could trigger further instability within the region. The situation also reflects a broader geopolitical context where India is reaffirming its commitment to counterterrorism and leveraging resources as a strategic tool in its bilateral relations with Pakistan.

### Jaishankar: India Seeks Partnerships, Not Preaching in Diplomacy SHARE

06-May-25

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar emphasized India's pursuit of partnerships based on mutual interests rather than ideological preaching, particularly in the context of the Russia-Ukraine conflict. He

highlighted India's pragmatic relationship with Russia, driven by national interests, and criticized Western attempts to resolve the conflict without engaging Moscow. Jaishankar noted that Europe's need for a reality check is crucial for fostering deeper ties with India, advocating for a balanced approach that acknowledges the complexities of international relations. He reiterated India's commitment to realism in diplomacy, asserting that solutions cannot be achieved without involving all relevant parties, particularly Russia.

### India Protests Canada Over Offensive Parade Imagery SHARE

India has lodged a protest with Canada over unacceptable imagery and threatening language targeting its leadership during a Toronto parade featuring pro-Khalistani propaganda. The protest follows recent tensions exacerbated by allegations from former Canadian Prime Minister Trudeau regarding Indian involvement in the killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, which India strongly denied. Despite the strain in bilateral relations, there are hopes for improvement under the new Canadian leadership, with an emphasis on mutual trust and countering extremism. India has urged Canada to take action against anti-India elements operating within its borders, reaffirming its commitment to protecting its sovereignty and combating separatist agendas.

## US House Speaker Affirms Support for India After Pahalgam Attack S SHARE

US House Speaker Mike Johnson reaffirmed the United States' commitment to support India in its fight against terrorism, particularly in light of the recent attack in Pahalgam that resulted in significant casualties. Compounding its challenges, Lufthansa Airlines suspended operations through Pakistani airspace following India's closure of its airspace to all Pakistaniregistered aircraft, signaling India's assertive stance in the region.

### Punjab Villagers Stay Vigilant Amid Rising Indo-Pak Border Tensions Start

Amid escalating tensions along the Indo-Pak border, villagers in Punjab's Fazilka district, alerted by local authorities, are preparing for potential conflict following recent terrorist attacks. Despite mixed concerns among residents, many are taking precautions, including emergency packing and blackout drills, while some remain calm, relying on their experiences from past evacuations. Community leaders are actively coordinating with security forces to maintain readiness, reflecting a blend of vigilance and resilience. The situation underscores the ongoing volatility in the region, highlighting the villagers' determination to support the Indian Army if necessary while hoping for resolution through dialogue.

### Geopolitical Conflict Surpasses Inflation as Top Business Concern S SHARE

A recent survey by GlobalData reveals that 36% of businesses now prioritize geopolitical conflict as their most significant concern, surpassing inflation for the first time in ten quarters. ### Zelensky's Strategic Win: US-Ukraine Minerals Deal Secures Resources SHARE

## Maldives Revises Defense Pacts with India to Ensure Sovereignty Share

Despite criticisms from opposition leaders about the validity of Muizzu's claims regarding these agreements, the Maldives aims to maintain strong ties with India, a crucial maritime partner in the Indian Ocean Region. India remains committed to its "Neighborhood First" policy, emphasizing regional security and cooperation.

### Can Pakistan Sustain Military Actions Amidst Economic Strain? Strain

### Iranian FM Araghchi's Visit to Boost India-Iran Ties Amid Tensions S SHARE

## UN Urges India and Pakistan to Avoid Escalating Military Conflict S SHARE

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres expressed deep concern over escalating tensions between India and Pakistan, urging both nations to exercise maximum restraint to avoid military confrontation following the recent terror attack in Pahalgam that claimed 26 lives. ### Global Airlines Avoid Pakistan Airspace, Costing Millions Amid Tensions Share

Major global airlines, including Lufthansa and Air France, have avoided Pakistani airspace due to escalating India-Pakistan tensions following a terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir, inflicting significant economic losses on Pakistan. This decision, in retaliation to Pakistan closing its airspace to Indian airlines, is projected to cost Pakistan millions in lost overflight fees, with estimates reaching \$300-400 million annually. Pakistan's reliance on these fees, alongside its precarious financial situation marked by soaring inflation and debt, exacerbates its crisis. Analysts suggest that Pakistan's airspace closure and subsequent isolation could destabilize the nation further, highlighting the broader geopolitical ramifications of its actions.

## MoD Mulls 155mm Artillery Shell Export Ban Amid Rising Tensions State

The Indian Ministry of Defence is considering a ban on the export of 155mm artillery shells amid escalating tensions with Pakistan, particularly following the recent Pahalgam massacre. While India's defense industry, including public and private firms, has ramped up production for global markets, the MoD aims to prioritize domestic wartime needs, as a full-scale conflict could demand significantly more shells than currently produced. Critics warn that such a ban could hinder India's defense export ambitions, which reached ₹21,083 crore in FY 2023-24, potentially jeopardizing hard-won international markets. However, the MoD's caution reflects a strategic imperative to ensure national security over commercial interests amidst geopolitical challenges.

### **Military Operations**

### Pakistani Troops Fire Unprovoked Along LoC; Indian Army Strikes Back Share

Pakistani troops have engaged in unprovoked firing along the Line of Control (LoC) for the 12th consecutive night, impacting five districts in Jammu and Kashmir. This escalation follows a terror attack in Pahalgam on April 22 that resulted in 26 fatalities, heightening tensions between India and Pakistan. The Indian Army has responded with proportional force to these provocations, which undermine the February 2021 ceasefire agreement, now viewed as largely ineffective due to consistent violations by Pakistan. The situation is further complicated by Pakistan's retaliatory measures, including airspace restrictions and threats regarding the Indus Waters Treaty. The ongoing hostilities reflect the deteriorating security dynamics in the region, necessitating a robust Indian defense strategy to ensure national security and stability along its borders.
