Military Operations

India Thwarts Pakistan's Military Aggression with Advanced Defense Systems

08-May-25

India's military response to recent Pakistani aggression has been marked by significant developments, including the successful foiling of drone and missile attacks targeting various Indian cities and military installations. The Indian Armed Forces utilized the advanced S-400 air defence system, referred to as "Sudarshan Chakra," to intercept all incoming threats, showcasing India's growing military capabilities. This response was part of a larger operation, "Operation Sindoor," which involved precision strikes on terrorist camps in Pakistan following a deadly attack attributed to militant groups. By focusing exclusively on dismantling terrorist infrastructure while avoiding civilian casualties, India demonstrated a commitment to measured retaliation and non-escalation, despite increased cross-border firing from Pakistan. The strategic use of HARPY drones for Suppression of Enemy Air Defence (SEAD) further highlights India's technological sophistication, allowing targeted strikes against enemy radars. This military exchange underscores the ongoing tensions between the two nuclear-armed neighbors, with India committed to defending its sovereignty while maintaining a posture of restraint. The collection of debris from the thwarted attacks will likely serve as evidence in India's diplomatic engagements, reinforcing its longstanding allegations of Pakistan's support for terrorism. Overall, the situation reflects the complexities of regional security dynamics,

with India's advanced air defence systems and precise military operations reinforcing its preparedness and resolve in the face of escalating hostilities.

India's Air Defence Strikes Back as Pakistan Targets Jammu

Recent tensions between India and Pakistan have escalated significantly, with Pakistan launching attacks on Jammu using loitering munitions and missiles, prompting a robust response from Indian Air Defence systems. Following India's precision strikes in Operation Sindoor against terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan, which resulted in the elimination of over 100 terrorists, Pakistan retaliated by targeting multiple military installations in northern and western India. Indian forces successfully intercepted and destroyed eight missiles aimed at key locations such as Jammu civil airport and RS Pura, employing the advanced S-400 air defence system, and neutralizing threats from Pakistani drones as well. The Indian government has emphasized its restrained approach, citing that these actions are responses to Pakistan's escalations, particularly following a recent terror attack in Pahalgam. Despite the ongoing cross-border shelling and civilian casualties, India has reiterated its commitment to non-escalation if Pakistan respects this stance. The situation remains tense, with both nations on high alert and the possibility of further military actions imminent. The Indian leadership, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has called for preparedness and civil defense improvements, while maintaining that the choice of de-escalation rests with Pakistan, which has thus far opted for further aggression. This dynamic highlights the delicate nature of India-Pakistan relations, where retaliatory measures are framed within the context of national security, counter-terrorism, and

the overarching goal to maintain regional stability amidst provocations.

## Pakistan Escalates Cross-Border Shelling in Jammu and Kashmir

Pakistani troops have engaged in cross-border shelling along the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu and Kashmir, targeting civilian areas in Kupwara and other regions, marking a significant rise in hostilities following India's Operation Sindoor, which targeted terror infrastructure in Pakistan. India's decisive military response highlights its commitment to national security while emphasizing the importance of international attention towards Pakistan's aggressive actions that endanger peace in the region.

## Discrepancies Arise Over Casualty Counts in India-Pakistan Strikes

## Lance Naik Dinesh Kumar from Haryana killed in LoC shelling

Lance Naik Dinesh Kumar of the 5-Field Regiment was killed in intense Pakistani shelling along the Line of Control (LoC) in the Poonch sector of Jammu and Kashmir on May 7, 2025, amid escalating tensions following India's Operation Sindoor. The operation was launched in retaliation to a prior terror attack and aimed at targeting terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. Dinesh, 32, hailed from a village in Palwal, Haryana, leaving behind a grieving family, including his wife and two young children. The Indian Army Chief, General Upendra Dwivedi, along with all ranks, paid tribute to Dinesh's sacrifice and emphasized the Army's commitment to solidly responding to ceasefire violations and protecting civilians impacted by such provocations. The Indian Army also expressed solidarity with innocent civilians affected by the shelling, condemning Pakistan's indiscriminate artillery attacks. The tragic incident underscores the persistent threat posed by cross-border hostilities and reflects the Indian Army's resolve to thwart any nefarious designs of adversaries, reaffirming its readiness to respond firmly to provocations while prioritizing the safety of its personnel and civilians. This situation highlights the ongoing risks faced by Indian armed forces and the need for a relentless commitment to national security, emphasizing the critical importance of strategic operations like Operation Sindoor in maintaining regional stability.

## Shehbaz Sharif vows retaliation after India's Operation Sindoor SHARE

Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has vowed to retaliate against India's Operation Sindoor, which targeted nine terror sites in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir, including hideouts of key terrorists like Masood Azhar and Hafiz Saeed, following a deadly terror attack in Pahalgam. While Sharif emphasized a united front against India, Pakistan's Defence Minister acknowledged the possibility of de-escalation if India changes its military stance. Despite Pakistan's historical ties to terrorism, India maintains that its actions were necessary and measured responses aimed at neutralizing threats without escalating conflict. This underscores India's commitment to counter-terrorism while aiming to avoid broader hostilities.

## Indian Drones Outsmart Pakistani Defenses in Operation Sindoor SHARE

In a significant counter-terrorism operation dubbed Operation Sindoor, India employed advanced loitering munitions, including the Bengaluru-made SkyStriker and DRDO's Low-Cost Miniature Swarm Drone, to precision strike nine terrorist camps in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. The operation, executed on May 7, 2025, showcased India's technological superiority, as the drones evaded Pakistani air defenses, resulting in the destruction of key terror infrastructure with no reported civilian casualties. This operation reflects India's evolving defense strategy that combines indigenous capabilities and collaborative technologies while maintaining a measured approach to counter-terrorism, despite Pakistan's claims of casualties and heightened tensions following the strikes.

## Debris Near Amritsar May Link S-400 to Foiled Pakistani Attack SHARE

On May 8, 2025, debris believed to be from a missile was discovered in Jathuwal village, Amritsar, triggering heightened security measures amid escalated India-Pakistan tensions following India's Operation Sindoor. The Indian Defence Research Wing identified the remnants as a possible 48N6 missile from India's S-400 air defense system, which is crucial for intercepting adversarial threats at considerable ranges. Residents reported loud explosions and illuminated objects in the sky early that morning, correlating with the missile debris findings. Local authorities, including the Army

and police, cordoned off the area while emphasizing safety protocols. Reports suggest the debris may relate to an attempted Pakistani strike using guided multiple rocket launchers, although the Indian side has not confirmed the nature of the explosions. The Press Information Bureau of India also debunked Pakistani narratives claiming casualties from a strike in Amritsar, highlighting misinformation campaigns. This incident underscores the strategic importance of India's air defense systems in countering threats from Pakistan, particularly in the volatile border regions where the S-400 has been deployed. The situation reflects the broader geopolitical struggle between India and Pakistan, highlighting India's proactive defense measures aimed at ensuring national security while countering disinformation efforts from across the border.

## IAF Recalls Gaganyaan Astronaut Ajit Krishnan Amid Tensions SHARE

Indian Air Force Group Captain Ajit Krishnan, an astronaut-designate for the Gaganyaan mission, has been recalled to duty amid tensions with Pakistan following Operation Sindoor. His return to the IAF was prompted by national security concerns, reflecting the importance of defense readiness alongside space exploration. Krishnan, a seasoned pilot with extensive flight experience, highlighted the astronaut training collaboration with ISRO in Bengaluru for future missions. The Gaganyaan mission aims to send three astronauts into low Earth orbit by 2027, representing India's commitment to advancing its space capabilities while maintaining national security priorities, underscoring the dual focus on defense and space exploration in India's strategic outlook.

## Army Chief Meets PM Modi Amid Rising Tensions with Pakistan SHARE

In a recent escalation of tensions between India and Pakistan, Indian Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi met with Prime Minister Narendra Modi following a series of retaliatory military actions. This meeting coincides with Pakistan's attempted missile and drone attacks on Indian military targets, which were effectively thwarted by India's Integrated Counter-UAS Grid and air defense systems. In response to these provocations, the Indian Armed Forces executed precise strikes against Pakistani air defense installations, including a successful operation near Lahore. The backdrop of these events includes the April

22 terrorist attack in Pahalgam that killed 26 individuals, prompting India's measured yet resolute military response. High-level meetings are taking place in Delhi involving the Prime Minister, the National Security Advisor, and the Defence Minister, indicating a serious approach to national security. U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio has called for de-escalation while reaffirming support for India in the fight against terrorism. The situation underscores India's commitment to a proportional response to aggression while emphasizing that further attacks on Indian military assets will prompt strong countermeasures, reflecting a robust defense strategy to safeguard national interests and maintain regional stability.

## Rising Tensions: Indian Airstrikes Ignite Calls for Retaliation in Pakistan

Recent escalations between India and Pakistan have seen significant military actions, including extensive Indian airstrikes targeting alleged militant bases in Pakistan, deemed a direct response to previous terrorist attacks. The strikes have incited strong reactions in Pakistan, with public outcry for military retaliation, reflecting deep-seated animosities and a national sentiment demanding action against India. Pakistani ODI captain Mohammad Rizwan echoed this sentiment, emphasizing the need for unity and courage in the face of what he termed an imposed war by India. While many in Pakistan call for decisive military action, others caution against the catastrophic consequences of a full-scale conflict, considering Pakistan's existing struggles with economic and security challenges. India's strikes, particularly significant for targeting Punjab, have been celebrated domestically as necessary measures to counter terrorism, with public support for a robust military response. The rapidly escalating rhetoric and military engagements raise fears of a larger conflict, suggesting that diplomatic resolutions are increasingly elusive amidst the fervor for retaliation and national pride on both sides.

## Operation Sindoor: India Strikes Terror Camps in Pakistan

The Indian Armed Forces executed Operation Sindoor, targeting nine terrorist infrastructure sites in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), notably the Muridke complex associated with Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), in response to the April 22 Pahalgam terrorist attack that resulted in 26 civilian fatalities. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh reported that the operation

eliminated at least 100 terrorists, with a focus on minimizing collateral damage and avoiding escalation with Pakistan's military facilities. The strike was characterized as precise and restrained, emphasizing India's commitment to dismantling the operational capabilities of terrorist groups like Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) and LeT, while maintaining a stance of readiness against any retaliatory action from Pakistan. Political unity was evident during an all-party meeting where leaders supported the government's response to terrorism, highlighting a national consensus on national security. In the wake of these developments, Pakistan has vowed to respond at a time of its choosing, and both nations have engaged in military posturing, raising concerns about further escalations. The situation remains highly volatile, with international calls for restraint and continued monitoring of the situation by global powers, including the United States. India's proactive strategy marks a significant shift in its counter-terrorism policy, moving away from defensive measures and emphasizing direct action against terrorist infrastructure across borders.

## Mastermind of IC-814 Hijacking, Abdul Rauf Azhar, Killed

Indian forces conducted Operation Sindoor, targeting key terrorists associated with groups like Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) in retaliation for the Pahalgam attack that claimed 26 lives. Notably, the operation resulted in the death of Abdul Rauf Azhar, the mastermind behind the 1999 IC-814 hijacking and linked to the murder of Wall Street Journal reporter Daniel Pearl. This focused and measured operation avoided Pakistani military installations while striking at the heart of terror networks, reportedly killing over 100 terrorists, according to Defence Minister Rajnath Singh. The elimination of Azhar marks a significant blow to JeM and similar Pakistan-based groups, enhancing India's counter-terrorism efforts against those responsible for historic attacks. The strikes have garnered positive reactions from international observers, with many recognizing it as a form of delayed justice for Pearl's killing. India's strategic approach, emphasizing precision strikes while minimizing escalation, demonstrates its commitment to national security and counter-terrorism. The operation not only aims to dismantle terror infrastructure but also reinforces India's resolve against transnational terrorism, sending a clear message to those orchestrating attacks from across its borders.



## Four Chinese Nationals Arrested Attempting Illegal Entry at Raxaul SHARE

Four Chinese citizens were arrested at the Indo-Nepal border in Raxaul while attempting to illegally enter India without visas. This operation, conducted by the Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB) and local police, comes amidst heightened security measures due to Operation Sindoor in East Champaran, with a focus on border vigilance. The individuals, identified as residents of Hunan province, had no valid documents. Their arrest underscores the ongoing challenges India faces regarding border security and illegal immigration, necessitating robust monitoring and collaborative efforts between security agencies to safeguard national sovereignty.

## Wreckage of Pakistani LY-80 SAM Found Near Gujranwala, Raising Concerns SHARE

Reports indicate that wreckage from a Pakistani LY-80 (HQ-16) surface-to-air missile system has been found near Gujranwala, Punjab, raising questions about the incident's cause, including potential malfunction or unscheduled testing. This system is crucial for Pakistan's air defense, capable of engaging aerial threats up to 70 kilometers. The lack of an official statement from the Pakistani military leaves room for speculation about operational readiness and safety protocols. This incident highlights the importance of maintaining robust air defense systems in the region, emphasizing India's vigilance and strategic posture to counter any airborne threats effectively.

## Indian Harop Drone Allegedly Strikes Pakistan's HQ-16 Battery in Lahore. SHARE

On May 8, 2025, unverified reports emerged that an Indian Air Force IAI Harop loitering munition struck a Chinese-made HQ-16 (LY-80) surface-to-air missile battery operated by Pakistan's 4th Air Defence Regiment in Walton, Lahore, injuring four soldiers and damaging a military truck. The HQ-16 system, crucial for regional air defense, forms a key layer in Pakistan's integrated architecture against aerial threats. In response, Pakistan claimed to have intercepted over a dozen Harop drones, deploying both "soft-kill" electronic measures and "hard-kill" weapons to neutralize 25 drones near major cities including Lahore

and Karachi. The Pakistani military elevated alert levels across the Punjab region and conducted live-fire exercises involving JF-17 fighter jets and AH-1Z helicopters to reinforce its air defenses. New Delhi's defense establishment confirmed that these preemptive strikes aimed to degrade Pakistan's integrated air defense system but refrained from officially acknowledging specific targets. International stakeholders, including the United States and China, have urged restraint amid fears of escalation along the de facto border and emphasized the need for diplomatic dialogue to prevent a broader conflict.

## Drone Flights Banned in J&K and Ladakh After Security Threats SHARE

Authorities have banned drone and UAV flights in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh following Pakistan's failed attempts to target Indian Air Force stations with drones and missiles. The Integrated Counter UAS Grid and Air Defence successfully neutralized these threats, prompting local officials to prohibit unauthorized drone operations due to security concerns. This ban aims to prevent misuse by anti-social elements and safeguard public safety and security installations. Such measures illustrate India's proactive stance in countering aerial threats, particularly from Pakistan, which has a history of using drones for nefarious activities across the Line of Control.

## Pakistan Promises Retaliation After Indian Airstrikes, Claims Jet Losses SHARE

Following recent Indian airstrikes targeting terrorist sites in Pakistan, Pakistan has claimed a significant victory, asserting that it downed five Indian fighter jets during a confrontation. India, while not confirming any losses, has stated that its strikes successfully hit multiple targets and presented video evidence. Analysts note that while both sides present conflicting narratives, the nature of modern aerial combat involves long-range engagements rather than traditional dogfights. The veracity of Pakistan's claims remains under scrutiny, particularly as India's video footage may contradict them. Ultimately, both nations appear to have experienced operational setbacks, underscoring the complexities of aerial engagements in the region.

## Drone explosion near Kutch border sparks investigation by forces

A drone explosion occurred near Gujarat's Kutch border, prompting the Air Force, Army, and police to launch an investigation amid heightened tensions following Operation Sindoor. The incident took place early Thursday, with reports of a large drone hovering over villages before crashing and detonating in a park. The Indian Air Force has taken possession of the wreckage for further analysis, indicating proactive measures to address cross-border threats. This incident underscores the ongoing security challenges in the region and the necessity for robust surveillance and intelligence operations to safeguard India's borders against potential aerial intrusions.

## Rajnath Singh: India Thwarts Pakistan's Missile Attack Efforts



08-May-25

Indian Defence Minister Rajnath Singh announced the neutralization of Pakistan's overnight missile and loitering munitions attack on Indian territories during Operation Sindoor, following India's preemptive strikes on terror infrastructure in Pakistan. The Indian air defense, utilizing the S-400 and indigenous Akash systems, successfully intercepted all threats aimed at civilian and military locations. In retaliation, India targeted Pakistani air defense systems, reportedly destroying a HQ-9 in Lahore, while reaffirming its commitment to a measured response unless provoked. The ongoing tensions along the Line of Control have been exacerbated by increased unprovoked Pakistani artillery fire, resulting in civilian casualties, prompting a necessary Indian response.

## PSL Match Canceled Amid Indian Army's Precision Strikes

The Pakistan Super League (PSL) match between Peshawar Zalmi and Karachi Kings was cancelled due to Indian precision strikes targeting military assets in Pakistan, including air defense radars. This escalation follows India's response to a deadly terrorist attack in Pahalgam that claimed 26 lives. The Pakistan Cricket Board is contemplating relocating the remaining PSL matches to countries like Doha or Dubai, given the security concerns and the urgency expressed by foreign players seeking to leave Pakistan. This incident underscores the heightened tensions between India and Pakistan, highlighting India's proactive defense strategy and commitment to national security.

## Ex-US Pilot Backs Indian Rafales Amid India-Pakistan Tensions

Dale Stark, a former US Air Force pilot, expressed confidence in the Indian military following Operation Sindoor, which targeted terror camps linked to Jaish-e-Mohammed in Pakistan. He highlighted India's Rafale jets, enhanced with advanced systems and precision weapons, as superior to Pakistan's F-16s, which face operational limitations and maintenance challenges. Stark noted the Rafale's advanced capabilities, such as beyond-visual-range missiles and superior radar systems, provide the Indian Air Force with an edge. In contrast, Pakistan's JF-17 lacks the performance and survivability of the Rafale, underscoring India's strategic advantage in the region amidst rising tensions.

## IAF Secures Chandigarh Airport; All Flights Cancelled Amid Security Ops

The Indian Air Force (IAF) has taken control of Chandigarh airport, leading to the cancellation of all 52 flights, following missile strikes on terrorist hideouts in Pakistan as part of "Operation Sindoor" after a deadly terror attack in Pahalgam. The airport's management confirmed operations are suspended due to regional airspace conditions, leaving many passengers stranded and facing high transportation costs for alternative travel. Despite the disruptions, passengers largely understood the necessity for heightened security measures. This decisive action underscores India's commitment to national security and the proactive steps taken by the defense forces to protect citizens from emerging threats.

## India Strikes Back: Major Military Response to Pakistan's Drone Attack

The blackouts, effective from 9 pm to 5 am, aim to prepare residents for potential emergencies, especially in light of a suspicious object that fell in Hoshiarpur. The ban on fireworks and the formation of task forces to prevent hoarding reflect proactive measures taken to maintain public safety and order. Officials have urged calm and cooperation, emphasizing the need for adherence to security protocols amid evolving regional threats, showcasing India's commitment to safeguarding its citizens during heightened military readiness.

## MoS Defence Sanjay Seth in Moscow for 80th Victory Day celebrations

## “Operation Sankalp: 22 Naxalites Neutralized in Chhattisgarh”

This offensive, involving around 28,000 personnel from various units, targets entrenched Maoist infrastructure across nearly 800 sq km. So far, 151 Naxalites have been neutralized in the Bastar division this year. The operation has successfully disrupted insurgent logistics, recovering numerous arms, explosives, and supplies, while also incurring some injuries among security personnel. This decisive action underscores India's commitment to combating left-wing extremism and restoring peace in regions plagued by Maoist insurgency, reflecting the strategic focus on enhancing internal security stability.

## India Sets Sights on Mars and Venus for Future Space Missions
