MoD Briefing Day 3:India Thwarts 400- Drone Barrage, Missiles and Debuts S-400 “Sudarshan Chakra”



09-May-25

On May 9, during Day 3 of Operation Sindoor, India's Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri and Defence Ministry officials held a joint briefing revealing that Pakistan had launched an unprecedented swarm of 300–400 Turkish Asisguard Songar drones against 36 strategic targets along the International Border and Line of Control from Leh to Sir Creek, all of which were intercepted using both kinetic and non-kinetic measures. The briefing highlighted India's S-400 'Sudarshan Chakra' air-defense system achieving its first combat engagement by downing eight incoming missiles aimed at Jammu airport and nearby military installations. In parallel, Indian forces executed SEAD/DEAD strikes on multiple Pakistani air-defense radars in Lahore and PoK, and armed drones neutralized at least one radar while striking four key air-defense sites. The Ministry of External Affairs reiterated that all actions were in strict adherence to India's right to self-defence under the UN Charter, affirmed minimal civilian harm with ongoing humanitarian assistance for border communities, and cautioned that further measures await Pakistan's next move. Foreign Secretary Misri also condemned Pakistan for shelling that targeted religious sites in India, notably a tragic incident in Poonch where shells struck a Christian school, killing two students, and shelling of a Gurudwara a day before and stressed that the deliberate targeting of places of worship marks a new low in cross-border hostilities.

India Downs scores of Pakistani Drones Amid Rising Tensions Along LoC

In a significant escalation of tensions between India and Pakistan, the Indian Army shot down Pakistani drones during a large-scale counter-drone operation along the Line of Control (LoC) and International Borders (IB), after Pakistan attempted to breach Indian airspace with a swarm of 300 to 400 drones, some reportedly Turkish-made Asisguard Songar models. This coordinated assault targeted multiple military installations and strategic sites across a vast geographical area, from Jammu & Kashmir to Rajasthan, aiming to probe India's air defense capabilities. India's advanced air defense systems, including the Akash missile system and integrated counter-UAS grid, effectively neutralized the aerial threats, showcasing India's preparedness to counter such provocations swiftly. The Indian government characterized the drone assaults as a blatant breach of the February 2021 ceasefire agreement, and in a measured response, conducted precision strikes that targeted multiple Pakistani military sites, reinforcing India's commitment to defend its territorial integrity while maintaining a focus on civilian safety. The incident highlights the evolving nature of warfare in the region and emphasizes the importance of robust defense mechanisms in safeguarding national security amid heightened hostilities.

Defence Ministry Urges Media to Avoid Live Coverage of Operations

The Indian Ministry of Defence has issued an advisory urging media outlets to avoid live coverage of defence operations and the movement of security forces, citing

risks to operational effectiveness and personnel safety. The advisory underscores the importance of responsible reporting, referencing past incidents like the Kargil War and the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks, which saw adverse consequences from premature disclosure. It reiterates that media coverage should be limited to periodic briefings by designated officials, as per the Cable Television Networks (Amendment) Rules, 2021, emphasizing the shared moral responsibility to safeguard national security. This move reflects the government's commitment to maintaining operational integrity and protecting the lives of security personnel.

BSF Eliminates 7 Terrorists and Dismantles Pak Rangers Post in Jammu

On the night of May 8–9, 2025, BSF troops in Jammu's Samba district detected and foiled a major Jaish-e-Mohammed infiltration bid along the International Border, killing seven terrorists in fierce firefights tracked by the BSF surveillance grid. Intelligence revealed that Pakistan Rangers at the Dhandhar post had provided cover for the militants, leading BSF units to destroy the post's bunker and force any survivors to retreat across the border. This counter-infiltration followed India's Operation Sindoor airstrikes on terror camps in Pakistan and PoK on May 7–8—conducted after a deadly April 23 Pahalgam attack that claimed 27 lives—and underscored New Delhi's willingness to carry out punitive cross-border actions. Simultaneously, Pakistan launched drone overflights and missile strikes against Indian military installations, which were intercepted by air defenses and BSF quick-reaction teams. Despite these successes, heavy mortar fire from across the border continues to endanger civilian areas in Jammu, causing casualties and displacement. Union Minister Jitendra Singh praised the BSF's vigilance, stressing the need to modernize surveillance infrastructure, reinforce border forces, and maintain a robust defense posture against evolving threats.

India's Air Defense Systems Thrive Amid Rising Border Tensions

"The recent escalation in border tensions has highlighted the effectiveness of India's indigenous air defense systems, particularly the Akash and upgraded L-70 guns, which successfully thwarted multiple drone and missile attacks launched by Pakistan along the Line of Control (LoC). The Indian Army and Air Force deployed these systems, showcasing a robust response that not only neutralized threats but also demonstrated

India's ability to safeguard its airspace while conducting targeted counterstrikes against Pakistani military installations. The Akash missile system has proven crucial in defense operations, integrating seamlessly with advanced command-and-control networks like Akashteer, which coordinates various air defense elements to ensure rapid threat response. The Government's strategic investments in upgrading India's air defense architecture, including the acquisition of systems like the S-400 and Barak-8, have significantly enhanced operational readiness, allowing India to maintain air superiority in challenging scenarios. This multi-layered defense strategy, bolstered by indigenous technology and operational innovation, underscores India's commitment to national security and its readiness to confront escalating aerial threats effectively, sending a clear message that it is prepared to defend its sovereignty decisively while also projecting power beyond its borders.

Rajnath Singh Reviews National Security Amid Drone Threats from Pakistan

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh conducted a crucial review of India's national security situation with top military officials following Pakistan's recent attempts to target Indian military installations using drones and missiles. The high-level meeting, attended by the Chief of Defence Staff and the chiefs of the Army, Air Force, and Navy, occurred after Indian forces successfully repelled these attacks, showcasing their robust defense capabilities. Reports indicated that Indian forces neutralized threats to significant military sites in Jammu, Pathankot, and Udhampur, employing advanced systems, including the S-400 air defense system, and executing Operation Sindoor to strike terror infrastructure in Pakistan in retaliation for earlier attacks. The composed demeanor of Singh and the military leadership during the meeting conveyed confidence in India's defense posture, emphasizing the nation's preparedness to safeguard its sovereignty. This series of events highlights India's strategic military readiness and its commitment to protecting national security against provocations, reinforcing the message that any aggression from Pakistan will be met with decisive action. Overall, India's proactive measures and strong defense infrastructure demonstrate its capability to deter threats and respond effectively, ensuring stability along its western border and maintaining peace in the region.

Indian Army Destroys Pakistani Military Post Amid Ceasefire Violations

The Indian Army has released a video showcasing the destruction of a Pakistani military post, responding to a series of ceasefire violations and drone attacks by Pakistan along the Line of Control. This operation highlights India's commitment to safeguarding its sovereignty, with successful neutralization of multiple threats, including drones and Pakistan's Airborne Warning and Control System (AWACS). India's decisive action, which included targeting air defense systems and military stations, signifies a robust stance against cross-border aggression. The Ministry of Defence has reiterated a strong willingness to respond to any military provocations, emphasizing that Pakistan must choose de-escalation to avoid further escalations in tension.

India Mobilizes Territorial Army Amid Rising Tensions with Pakistan

The Indian government has empowered the Chief of Army Staff to fully mobilize the Territorial Army (TA) amid escalating tensions with Pakistan, enabling the deployment of 14 out of 32 Infantry Battalions to support regular Army units across multiple commands from February 2025 to February 2028. This decision, taking effect under the Territorial Army Rule 1948, is a strategic move to bolster national defense capabilities in light of recent hostilities, including thwarted infiltration attempts by terrorists and missile strikes directed at Indian military installations. The Ministry of Home Affairs has also urged states and Union Territories to invoke emergency powers for precautionary measures, while the Border Security Force successfully neutralized an infiltration attempt from Pakistan. Additionally, civilian casualties were reported in Jammu and Kashmir due to Pakistani shelling, further intensifying the conflict dynamics. India has responded robustly to provocations, including missile strikes against Pakistani positions, signaling a firm stance on national security. The mobilization of the TA reflects India's proactive approach to enhancing its military readiness and addressing security threats, emphasizing the integrated role of the TA in supporting national defense efforts while ensuring military preparedness.

India's S-400 System Deployed Against PAF Jets, Not Drones

Recent reports underscore the effectiveness of India's S-400 "Sudarshan Chakra" air defense system in repelling threats from Pakistan, particularly following Operation Sindoor. The IAF deployed the S-400 selectively against high-value targets, such as PAF fighter jets, rather than low-cost threats like drones and MLRS, which are managed by other systems like Akash and upgraded L-70 guns. During a recent escalation, India successfully intercepted all incoming missiles and drones from Pakistan, showcasing the S-400's advanced capabilities and solidifying India's air defense strategy. This operational success not only thwarted Pakistani attempts to strike military installations but also led to the downing of a PAF F-16, marking a significant achievement for ground-based air defense. The S-400, with its ability to track targets at distances of up to 600 km and engage threats at 400 km, has been integral in maintaining a layered defense architecture that also incorporates other indigenous systems. This integrated approach has successfully deterred Pakistani aerial incursions and shifted the regional balance of power in India's favor, emphasizing the strategic importance of the S-400 in enhancing India's air superiority. Furthermore, the situation highlighted the effectiveness of India's rapid response capabilities, combining various air defense assets to neutralize threats and protect critical military assets. India's investments in advanced air defense technologies, including the S-400, Barak-8, and Akash systems, reflect a robust commitment to ensuring national security amid rising regional tensions, reinforcing its deterrent posture against evolving aerial threats.

Indian Army soldier M Murali Naik martyred in LoC firing

Indian Army jawan M Murali Naik, aged 25, was martyred during cross-border firing by Pakistani forces along the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu and Kashmir amid heightened tensions following India's Operation Sindoor. The young soldier, hailing from Kalli Thanda in Andhra Pradesh, was critically injured during heavy artillery attacks and succumbed to his injuries despite efforts to airlift him for treatment. His sacrifice has been widely acknowledged, with Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, Governor Syed Abdul Nazeer, and others expressing condolences and honoring his bravery. Chief Minister Naidu highlighted

the need for unity against terrorism, commending the boldness of Operation Sindoor in countering cross-border threats. Reports indicate that the Indian Army has retaliated effectively, destroying multiple Pakistani posts in the region, and addressing drone infiltration attempts by Pakistan. The incident reflects the ongoing challenges faced by the Indian defense forces in maintaining national security and countering terrorism, underscoring the commitment of the armed forces to protect the nation. Murali Naik's martyrdom serves as a poignant reminder of the sacrifices made by soldiers in the line of duty, fostering a sense of pride and patriotism among the people. His family's plight has resonated deeply within the community, reinforcing the support for the armed forces and the government's efforts to combat terrorism and safeguard peace along the borders.

India Calls Defense Manufacturers to Boost Readiness Amid Tensions

The Indian government has summoned major defense manufacturers, including Bharat Forge, to a high-level meeting in Delhi amidst rising tensions with Pakistan, particularly following recent cross-border hostilities. This meeting underscores the urgency to enhance India's defense capabilities, with potential discussions on new contracts and accelerated production, particularly related to the Advanced Towed Artillery Gun Systems (ATAGS). Bharat Forge, a leader in defense manufacturing, has made significant strides in indigenous artillery development and strategic partnerships with global defense firms, aligning with India's Aatmanirbhar Bharat and Make in India initiatives. This proactive approach reflects India's commitment to strengthening its defense posture in a challenging geopolitical environment.

Rising Tensions: Heavy Shelling in Uri and Poonch Amid Conflicts

Recent updates indicate escalating tensions between India and Pakistan, marked by heavy shelling and military confrontations in areas like Uri, Poonch, and Jammu. Cross-Border Strikes Challenge Pakistan's Military Strategy

Recent developments in Pakistan, particularly concerning General Asim Munir and the military establishment, reveal a precarious situation for the Pakistani army amidst escalating tensions with India.

Cross-border strikes targeting militant infrastructure in Punjab have exposed vulnerabilities within Pakistan, challenging its longstanding use of non-state actors as strategic assets while underlining the growing impatience of neighboring states. General Munir faces immense pressure, as Pakistan's military grapples with a crisis of legitimacy domestically and the implications of India's decisive military actions, including strikes on multiple terror hubs and drone attacks on key installations. The military's inability to counter these actions without incurring further domestic backlash has left Munir in a difficult position, caught between the need to respond militarily and the potential for catastrophic defeat. The absence of traditional allies like the U.S. for crisis management compounds Pakistan's isolation, while India's doctrine of preemptive strikes aims to reshape the regional security dynamics. This situation not only underscores the limitations of Pakistan's conventional strategies but also indicates a shifting balance of power in South Asia, aligning with India's proactive defense posture and challenging Pakistan's narrative as a regional power.

IAF Confirms No Pilot Losses in Successful Operation Sindoor SHARE

The Indian Air Force (IAF) confirmed that no pilots were lost during Operation Sindoor, a large-scale retaliatory strike on May 7, 2025, targeting nine terrorist sites in Pakistan, following the deadly Pahalgam attack. The operation, involving 80-90 aircraft, utilized advanced weaponry like the BrahMos and SCALP missiles, showcasing India's military precision and operational capability. While IAF sources emphasized the success of the operation, they did not confirm the status of all air assets amid conflicting claims from Pakistan, which alleged the downing of several Indian aircraft. Bengaluru's SkyStriker Drones Unleashed in Operation Sindoor SHARE

The implementation of over 100 SkyStriker units, ordered in 2021, underscores India's commitment to advanced strike capabilities, addressing the evolving landscape of modern warfare that increasingly relies on loitering munitions and sensor-to-shooter technologies for

tactical superiority. This strategic move reinforces India's defensive posture in a volatile region.

Kerala Student Activist Arrested in Nagpur for Alleged Anti-India Plot SHARE

A student activist and journalist from Kerala, Rejaz M Sheeba Sydeek, was arrested in Nagpur for allegedly planning to wage war against the Indian government. He criticized military operations against terrorists and Naxalites and had literature promoting Marxism-Leninism in his possession. The police charged him under various sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, citing concerns over public safety and potential riots. His arrest highlights ongoing tensions regarding dissent and state security in India, underscoring the government's commitment to maintaining order amidst growing activism and criticisms surrounding its policies, particularly in conflict-affected regions.

Defense Business and Industry

Intact PL-15E Missile Found in Hoshiarpur Sparks Global Interest SHARE

A nearly intact Chinese PL-15E missile was discovered in Hoshiarpur, Punjab, prompting analysis by India's DRDO and attracting interest from the US, South Korea, and Japan. This find could reveal vulnerabilities in China's missile technology and enhance India's indigenous missile programs and electronic warfare systems. The missile's failure to detonate suggests inefficiencies or successful countermeasures by the IAF. The global interest underscores the strategic significance of understanding advanced defense technologies, potentially leading to strengthened defense collaborations while prioritizing India's own strategic interests in securing sensitive information. Ultimately, this opportunity could provide India a decisive advantage in future aerial conflicts.

Indian Navy Receives Arnala: First Indigenous Anti-Submarine Craft SHARE

The Indian Navy has received Arnala, the first of eight indigenously designed Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Crafts (ASW-SWCs), significantly enhancing its maritime capabilities. Delivered on May 8, 2025, by Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers in collaboration with L&T Shipyard, this 77-meter vessel is

equipped for underwater surveillance, search and rescue, and Low Intensity Maritime Operations. Arnala represents a major achievement in India's shipbuilding sector, showcasing the success of Public-Private Partnerships and aligning with the Aatmanirbhar Bharat initiative, with over 80% indigenous content. This milestone reflects India's commitment to bolstering its naval strength and maritime heritage.

IAF Aims to Boost Surveillance with Three High-Altitude Pseudo Satellites SHARE

The Indian Air Force (IAF) is acquiring three High-Altitude Platform Systems (HAPS) to enhance surveillance capabilities amid regional tensions, especially with Pakistan and China. These pseudo satellites will operate in the stratosphere at 20 km altitude, offering persistent intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance (ISR) capabilities without the logistical constraints of traditional aircraft. Domestic manufacturers, including Veda Aeronautics and NewSpace Research & Technologies, are vying to meet this requirement. Tejas Mk1A's First Flight from HAL Nashik Set for June 2025 SHARE

Mk1A Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) from its Nashik Division scheduled for June 2025. US VP Vance: India-Pakistan Conflict Is Not America's Concern SHARE

US Vice-President JD Vance has declared that the ongoing conflict between India and Pakistan is fundamentally none of America's business, emphasizing a stance of non-intervention while encouraging diplomatic de-escalation. This statement comes amid escalating tensions following India's military response to a terror attack in Kashmir, which included significant retaliatory strikes against terror targets in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). The US's current approach, characterized by diplomatic caution and a clear reluctance to become directly involved, aligns with India's longstanding concerns regarding Pakistan's support for terrorism, reinforcing India's strategic position in the region while also underlining the importance of bilateral communication to address security challenges.

Home Ministry Urges States to Activate Emergency Powers Amid Tensions SHARE
