Top Indian Military Leaders Unite to Discuss Operation Sindoor



11-May-25

In a significant development for India's military strategy, the top commanders from the Indian Army, Air Force, and Navy are set to hold a rare joint press conference to discuss the ongoing Operation Sindoor, emphasizing a unified military approach amidst rising regional tensions, particularly following the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack. Key leaders, including Lieutenant General Rajiv Ghai (DGMO, Indian Army), Air Marshal Awadhesh Kumar Bharti (DG Air Ops, Indian Air Force), and Vice Admiral AN Pramod (DG Naval Operations, Indian Navy), will outline the operation's progress and strategic outlook, spotlighting their roles in enhancing India's operational readiness and deterrence capabilities. The focus on tri-service coordination signals a decisive shift in India's security doctrine, reflecting a commitment to respond proactively to cross-border terrorism, while also preparing to address ceasefire violations and ensure civilian safety in conflict-prone areas like Jammu and Kashmir. This joint briefing is not just a display of military might but also a pivotal moment in India's defense strategy, highlighting the importance of seamless collaboration among the armed forces and reaffirming India's stance of maintaining the strategic initiative in the region, as articulated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in recent discussions with global leaders. The operation and the ensuing media briefing underscore India's readiness to adopt a new normal in national security, combining land, air, and naval strategies for comprehensive defense and deterrence operations.

Operation Sindoor: India Exposes Pakistan's Terror Links

Kashmir in response to the deadly Pahalgam attack, exposing the deep-seated ties between the Pakistani military and terror groups. IAF Confirms Ongoing Operation Sindoor Amid Ceasefire with Pakistan

The Indian Air Force (IAF) has confirmed that Operation Sindoor, launched in response to recent escalations from Pakistan, is ongoing despite a declared ceasefire between the two nations. The operation targets terror infrastructure deep within Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir, with precision strikes on key locations, including the Jaish-e-Mohammed headquarters in Bahawalpur and several airbases, effectively crippling Pakistan's military capabilities. Air Marshal AK Bharti detailed how the IAF utilized advanced munitions to minimize collateral damage while executing coordinated attacks on strategic targets, including military installations at Nur Khan, Rafiqui, and Sargodha, following a series of drone and missile provocations from Pakistan. The IAF emphasized its commitment to maintaining high alert status and reiterated that any future provocations would be met with decisive responses, showcasing a robust stance against cross-border terrorism. The operation marks a significant escalation in India's defense strategy, demonstrating its capabilities to neutralize threats effectively while upholding national security objectives. This proactive approach not only aims to deter further aggression but also indicates India's readiness to respond decisively to threats, reinforcing the notion that any attempts to undermine its sovereignty will be met with significant

countermeasures. The situation remains delicate, as the ceasefire is still in effect, yet the operational readiness of the Indian armed forces signifies a strong deterrence against any future provocations or violations along the India-Pakistan border.

India's Precision Strikes Eliminate 100+ Terrorists, Rattle Pakistan

In a decisive military operation named Operation Sindoor on May 7, the Indian Armed Forces targeted nine terrorist camps in Pakistan, resulting in over 100 terrorists killed, including high-value targets linked to the IC814 hijacking and the Pulwama attack. The precision strikes, which also reportedly killed 35-40 Pakistani soldiers, showcased India's military capability and strategic resolve. Following the operation, Pakistan's erratic response involved violations of the ceasefire agreement, including drone incursions and artillery attacks on civilian areas, which prompted further Indian retaliatory strikes at key military assets in Pakistan. The Indian military's strategy emphasized striking where it would have the most significant impact, specifically targeting terrorist infrastructure rather than civilian sites, contrasting Pakistan's indiscriminate attacks. The situation highlights the ongoing conflict dynamics, with India's commitment to counter-terrorism remaining firm, as emphasized by high-ranking officials during a media briefing. The international community, including the US and regional partners, has acknowledged the ceasefire reached between the two nations, yet the underlying tensions remain, with both sides posturing militarily. India's strong military response reflects an unwavering stance against Pakistani aggression, and the operation serves as a statement of deterrence against future terrorist activities, reinforcing India's regional security posture while pursuing diplomatic avenues for lasting peace.

Vice Admiral Pramod warns Pakistan: India will respond decisively.

Vice Admiral AN Pramod, Deputy Chief of Naval Operations, issued a stern warning to Pakistan, affirming India's naval readiness to strike Karachi if provoked, particularly in light of the April 22 terrorist attack in Pahalgam, which was attributed to Pakistan-backed groups. The Indian Navy has deployed its Carrier Battle Group and conducted live-fire drills, showcasing its capability to hit select targets with precision. Pramod emphasized that India's response remains measured and aimed at deterrence rather than

provocation, compelling Pakistan's naval units into a defensive posture. Operation Sindoor is a comprehensive military reaction that showcases India's decisive stance against terrorism while maintaining control over escalation.

India's Operation Sindoor Achieves Goals; Rafale Rumors Debunked

The Indian military recently held a press conference regarding Operation Sindoor, affirming that the mission's objectives were successfully achieved despite unconfirmed reports of downed Rafale jets. Air Marshal Bharti: 'All pilots safe' amid rising India-Pak tensions

India has accused Pakistan of violating a ceasefire agreement merely hours after it was established, with reports of gunfire and drone activity along the Line of Control (LoC). Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri condemned these provocations, affirming that Indian forces are prepared to respond firmly. Meanwhile, Pakistan's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif expressed hope for resolving key issues, including Kashmir, while thanking international allies for their support of peace efforts. India Responds Strongly as Pakistan Violates Ceasefire Agreement

India has accused Pakistan of violating a recently agreed-upon ceasefire just hours after its announcement, following escalated military tensions marked by India's Operation Sindoor targeting terrorist infrastructure in response to a deadly attack. The Indian government has signaled a shift in engagement rules, stating that any terrorist act from Pakistan would be viewed as an act of war, while also ramping up domestic defense production, particularly in

precision strike capabilities. This situation underscores India's proactive defense strategy, emphasizing its resolve against terrorism and its readiness to respond to provocations with significant force, reinforcing India's commitment to national security while navigating a complex geopolitical landscape marked by Pakistan's inconsistent adherence to ceasefire agreements.

Indian Air Force Medic Killed Amid Ongoing Pakistan Violations

Surendra Kumar, a 14-year veteran medical assistant in the Indian Air Force, was tragically killed in a Pakistani shelling incident in Udhampur, Jammu and Kashmir, leaving behind his wife Seema and two young children. Local officials and former military personnel extolled his patriotism and commitment to the nation, highlighting his recent contributions to the community and the emotional toll on his family following his death. Despite the announcement of a ceasefire between India and Pakistan, violations were reported almost immediately, indicating a severe lack of trust and responsibility from the Pakistani side. In a late briefing, Indian Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri condemned these actions and reaffirmed the Indian Armed Forces' readiness to respond to continued aggression. This situation underscores the ongoing tension along the India-Pakistan border and the crucial need for both nations to uphold any agreements made to prevent further escalation and ensure the safety of their military personnel and civilians alike.

Defence Minister: Indian Army's Might Resounds in Rawalpindi

EW Grid bolsters air defenses to thwart drone incursions [SHARE](#)

During recent India–Pakistan clashes, the Integrated Air Defense Systems were supplemented with electronic warfare (EW) measures to thwart Pakistani drones. Key to this was an EW Counter-UAS Grid that employed GNSS jammers, spoofers, and directed-energy emitters to disrupt drone control, navigation, and communications, creating an invisible electromagnetic shield. While anti-aircraft guns targeted low-flying loitering munitions, those outside the focus of guns and larger systems like S-400 Triumf, Akash and Barak/MR-SAM were countered by the grid's EW jammers. By severing radio-frequency links and corrupting GPS signals, these soft-kill measures compelled many UAVs to abort or enter failsafe mode. The recovery of many intact drones confirms the grid's efficacy and underscores the ascendancy of EW.

PM Modi Leads High-Level Security Meeting Amid Border Tensions [SHARE](#)

Prime Minister Narendra Modi chaired a high-level meeting on May 11 with Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval, Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan, and the tri-services chiefs, following a tense situation along the India-Pakistan border. This meeting came in the context of a recent understanding between both nations regarding the cessation of firing and military action, which was reportedly violated by Pakistan, leading to Indian retaliation after drone sightings and border intrusions. IAF Successfully Downed Pakistani Jets, All Pilots Safe: Air Marshal Bharti

The Indian Air Force (IAF) has confirmed that it successfully downed several high-tech Pakistani jets during Operation Sindoor, a retaliatory strike against cross-border terrorism following the Pahalgam attacks. Satellite Images Reveal Damage from India's Precision Strikes on Pakistan Air Bases

Indian Air Force (IAF) fighter jets executed a precision campaign targeting 11 military air bases across Pakistan from May 8 to 10, causing significant damage, particularly at the Nur Khan air base, a crucial hub for Pakistan's Air Mobility Command. This operation, dubbed Operation Sindoor, was a direct retaliation for a terror attack in Pahalgam that killed 26 civilians. Prime Minister Modi emphasized a stronger response to cross-border terrorism, indicating a shift in India's military doctrine. Following these strikes, India and Pakistan agreed to halt military actions, yet India remains firm that its engagement will only be through military channels, maintaining a tough stance against ongoing terrorism from Pakistan.

BLA Launches 39 Attacks in Balochistan Amid Local Grievances

The Baloch Liberation Army (BLA) has claimed responsibility for 39 coordinated attacks in Balochistan, targeting police stations, military convoys, and key infrastructure. This escalation reflects long-standing grievances over political marginalization and economic exploitation by the Pakistani state, particularly related to the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor. Despite Balochistan's wealth of resources, it remains underdeveloped, with widespread reports of human rights abuses against Baloch activists. The BLA argues that these resources benefit outsiders rather than the local population, intensifying calls for autonomy and highlighting the region's complex socio-political landscape. Such actions underline the urgent need for a reassessment of governance and development strategies in Balochistan.

India's Precision Strikes Disrupt Pakistan's Military Operations

On May 10, 2025, the Bholari Air Base in Pakistan was hit by an intense missile attack attributed to Indian forces, resulting in casualties, significant injuries, and damage to military assets, including the destruction of a Saab-2000 aircraft, a critical asset for Pakistan's operational capabilities. The assault occurred while key personnel were present at the hangar, leading to the immediate death of five individuals, including Squadron Leader Usman Yousaf, and leaving others injured and trapped under debris. Concurrently, Pakistan declared the runway at Rahim Yar Khan Airbase non-operational following another Indian airstrike involving a BrahMos-A missile, which created a massive crater, rendering the facility unusable for an estimated seven days. These developments underscore India's growing capacity for precision strikes, particularly with the deployment of advanced weaponry like the BrahMos missile, which not only seeks to disrupt Pakistan's military operations but also illustrates India's strategic commitment to safeguarding its national security interests amid escalating tensions. The attacks have provoked a strong response from Pakistani officials and heightened the ongoing conflict, indicating a significant shift in regional military dynamics and a demonstration of India's willingness to assert its military capabilities in the face of perceived threats. These incidents highlight the critical vulnerability of military infrastructure in the region, emphasizing the importance of strategic deterrence and the implications of advanced weapon

India is set to dispatch a delegation to the United Nations Security Council next week to present fresh evidence of Pakistan's complicity with terrorism and repeated ceasefire breaches along both the Line of Control and the International Border, following the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack and Pakistan's subsequent violation of the bilateral de-escalation understanding. Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said at a special briefing, calling on Islamabad to address these very serious violations and warning that Indian forces stand ready to respond firmly to any further incursions. The dossier will include documentation of Pakistan's alleged shielding of the Lashkar-e-Taiba proxy group The Resistance Front, whose name Islamabad successfully blocked from a UNSC statement condemning the Pahalgam attack. It will also spotlight Operation Sindoor—launched on May 7 against terrorist infrastructure in Pakistani-administered Kashmir—detailing precision strikes on militant camps and air defense targets. According to Indian media reports, the submission will feature intercepted communications and satellite imagery showing Pakistan-initiated artillery and mortar fire on the night of May 10, hours after a US-brokered ceasefire was announced. New Delhi will further emphasize cross-border firing incidents that have resulted in civilian casualties despite international mediation involving more than 30 countries. Islamabad has denied these allegations, with its Information Minister reiterating Pakistan's commitment to the truce in statements to the press. The upcoming session of the UNSC's 1267 Sanctions Committee will provide the forum for India to press for global action against Pakistan's support for terrorism and to seek accountability for the resumed hostilities.

Amitabh Bachchan commends Indian forces for Operation Sindoor's success.

Amitabh Bachchan praised the Indian armed forces for their decisive action in Operation Sindoor, which targeted terrorist camps in Pakistan following the Pahalgam attack that killed 26 tourists. He underscored the government's resolve to combat terrorism, highlighting that despite Pakistan's ceasefire violations, vigilance in border states remains high. The situation in Jammu and Kashmir and Punjab is reportedly peaceful, though alerts were issued in response to violations. Enhanced Security for Key Installations in J&K and Punjab Borders

This initiative aims to protect critical national infrastructure from potential threats, ensuring preparedness and resilience in various emergency situations. The emphasis on safeguarding scientific research underscores the vital role these institutions play in national security and disaster management, reflecting a proactive stance in addressing evolving security challenges.

Jammu and Kashmir, Punjab See Stability Amid Ceasefire Efforts

The situation in Jammu and Kashmir and Punjab remains stable, with no recent shelling reported, following a week marked by heavy cross-border hostilities after the Pahalgam terror attack and subsequent Operation Sindoor. An understanding reached between the Directors General of Military Operations from India and Pakistan aimed to halt military actions, although India has accused Pakistan of ceasefire violations. Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri emphasized India's readiness to respond decisively to any breaches. Despite a cautious return to normalcy,

vigilance remains high, reflecting the region's fragile peace amid historical tensions and trust issues between the two nations.

Chinese JY-27A Radars Fail to Detect Indian Jets in Operation Sindoor

BSF Trooper Killed, 7 Injured in Recent Pakistani Shelling in Jammu

A Border Security Force (BSF) trooper, sub-inspector Mohammed Imteyaz, was killed and seven others were injured due to Pakistani shelling along the International Border in Jammu's R S Pura sector. This incident occurred despite a recent ceasefire agreement between India and Pakistan, highlighting ongoing tensions. The BSF, responsible for patrolling over 2,000 kilometers of border, expressed deep condolences and plans to honor Imteyaz's sacrifice with a wreath-laying ceremony. This situation underscores the complexities of Indo-Pak relations and the challenges faced by Indian forces in maintaining security along the border, even amid diplomatic efforts to reduce hostilities.

India's MR-SAM Defeats Pakistan's Fateh-II, Strengthening Air Defense

The drones, validated in real combat scenarios, offer substantial benefits over conventional UAVs, including extended flight endurance. Defence Minister launches BrahMos unit, boosting UP's defense hub SHARE
