Military Operations

India's DGMO Warns of Strong Retaliation After Pakistan's Ceasefire Breach Share

12-May-25

India's Director General of Military Operations (DGMO), Lieutenant General Rajiv Ghai, highlighted the recent ceasefire understanding initiated by Pakistan on May 10, intended to de-escalate hostilities following a deadly terrorist attack in Pahalgam. While both sides initially agreed to halt cross-border firing and discuss troop reductions, Pakistan violated the ceasefire within hours, prompting India to issue a strong warning of retaliation. The subsequent DGMO-level talks on May 12 reaffirmed the commitment to avoid aggressive actions but also underscored the precarious nature of the ceasefire, as violations could trigger a robust military response. Importantly, India's Operation Sindoor, which targeted terror sites in Pakistan, underscored its firm security posture, with Prime Minister Modi indicating a shift towards a more resolute approach to national security. The ongoing dialogue reflects India's diplomatic efforts despite the challenges posed by Pakistan's provocations. India values peace and stability along the Line of Control but remains steadfast in its readiness to respond firmly to any violations, a stance reinforced by the full authority granted to army commanders for counteraction. This situation illustrates the complexities of India-Pakistan relations, where moments of potential diplomacy are often overshadowed by violations and the continuing threat of terrorism, compelling India to maintain a vigilant and proactive defense strategy.

India's precise strikes in Operation Sindoor result in heavy Pakistani losses. Share

India's Director General of Military Operations, Lt Gen Rajiv Ghai, confirmed that during Operation Sindoor between May 7-10, the Indian military inflicted significant losses on Pakistan, reportedly killing over 100 terrorists and leading to the loss of 35-40 Pakistani personnel. The operation was specifically aimed at targeting terror infrastructure without harming civilian targets, emphasizing India's precision strikes against nine terror hubs, including high-value individuals involved in past attacks like the Pulwama incident. While Pakistan attempted to retaliate with drone incursions, India successfully intercepted these threats, maintaining a strong air defense posture. The Indian Air Force, supported by the Navy, executed coordinated strikes on Pakistani military assets and air defense systems, sending a clear message of deterrence. However, despite a brief cessation of hostilities proposed by Pakistan, violations occurred shortly thereafter, indicating ongoing tensions. The Indian leadership has reiterated its resolve to respond fiercely any breaches, highlighting the military's preparedness to counter any future aggression from This Pakistan. situation underscores India's commitment to safeguarding its national security while adhering to a policy aimed at precision targeting and minimizing collateral damage during military operations.

India's Precision Strikes Force Pakistan to Seek Ceasefire Share

Indian defense forces recently showcased their military capabilities through precision strikes against Pakistani

India Showcases Wreckage from Downed Jet Share

Air Marshal: Operation Sindoor a decisive step against terrorism Share

war. Bharti emphasized that the operation targeted terrorists, not the Pakistani military or civilians, clarifying India's intent to fight against terrorism while maintaining operational readiness. He highlighted the effectiveness of India's air defense systems, which successfully thwarted Pakistani military efforts, asserting that India's indigenous capabilities have proven their worth in countering any technological threats. The Air Marshal's remarks indicate a firm stance on national security, projecting that India is prepared to respond decisively to any escalations while remaining focused on its core objective of combating terrorism.

Russia Rejects Ceasefire Proposal Amid Escalating Drone Attacks Share

In a recent escalation of the ongoing conflict, Russia launched over 100 drones targeting Ukraine, while rejecting a proposed 30-day ceasefire that Ukraine and European allies demanded before peace negotiations. Despite Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's offer for direct talks with Russian President Vladimir Putin in Turkey, the Kremlin has instead called for direct negotiations without a truce, raising concerns over continued violence, including a drone attack on Ukraine's railway infrastructure that injured a civilian worker. The situation reflects a complex diplomatic landscape, with the United States and European leaders attempting to mediate peace while facing resistance from Moscow, which appears unwilling to concede territory or negotiate terms that might suggest a loss in the conflict. The Ukrainian government remains committed to seeking peace, but public sentiment in Ukraine is mixed, with some expressing hope for potential agreements while others fear that Russia's reluctance to accept a ceasefire signals a protracted struggle ahead.

India's decisive military strikes redefine counterterrorism strategy. Share

India Pursues 111 Naval Utility Helicopters from US, France S SHARE

HAL Rejects Claims of Reselling U.K. Tech to Russia Share

India Speeds Up ₹22,500-Crore Spy Satellite Program to 1 Year Share

India has expedited its Rs 22,500-crore Space Based Surveillance (SBS-3) program, reducing the satellite deployment timeline from four years to one year, responding to heightened regional tensions, particularly with Pakistan. The initiative involves collaboration between ISRO and three private firms, aiming to deploy 52 Al-integrated satellites by 2026, enhancing geointelligence capabilities. Pakistani Analysts Slam Turkish Byker YIHA III Drones After Crashes Share
