# Nibe Ordnance and Premier Explosives Forge Joint Venture for Ammo Production Share

15-Dec-24

Nibe Ordnance and Maritime Limited has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Premier Explosives Limited to form a joint venture aimed at developing, manufacturing, and supplying ammunition, explosives, and aerospace products. This collaboration, with Nibe holding 51% and Premier holding 49%, is a significant step towards enhancing India's defense production capabilities, aligning with the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative to boost self-reliance in military supplies. Nibe's chairman emphasized the strategic importance of this partnership in transforming India's defense manufacturing landscape, with an aim to meet alobal domestic and demands. Explosives, a well-established company in the ammunition sector, has a history of supplying to the Indian defense forces, further bolstering the joint venture's potential to position India as a global leader in defense production.

# India Must Boost Aerodynamic Testing for Fighter Jet Programs S SHARE

15-Dec-24

S. Somanath, Chairman of ISRO, highlighted the urgent need for enhanced aerodynamic testing facilities in India to support its aerospace industry, particularly for defense projects like the Tejas Mk1A, MkII, and AMCA. Currently, critical tests are conducted abroad due to insufficient local resources, which hampers

development and incurs high costs. Somanath advocates for investment in domestic wind tunnel facilities akin to France's ONERA, emphasizing that while computational methods have improved, physical testing remains essential for accurate aerospace vehicle development. Establishing these facilities would foster self-reliance, reduce dependence on foreign resources, and strengthen India's position in aerospace technology and defense R&D.

# Kanpur's Ordnance Parachute Factory to Produce TEJAS Parachutes Share

The Ordnance Parachute Factory in Kanpur is set to manufacture indigenous parachutes for India's TEJAS jets, reinforcing the nation's commitment to selfreliance in defense manufacturing. This initiative will significantly reduce reliance on foreign suppliers for critical military equipment and enhance pilot safety during ejection scenarios, given the parachutes' design for high-speed operations up to 2,205 km/h. With a legacy dating back to 1941, the OPF has proven its innovation capabilities through successful systems like the P-7 heavy drop parachute, further solidifying India's defense manufacturing growing prowess technological advancements. This development marks a pivotal step toward bolstering indigenous capabilities in India's defense sector.

# IAF Launches First Officers in New Weapon Systems Branch Share

15-Dec-24

The Indian Air Force (IAF) has officially commissioned its first batch of officers in the newly established Weapon Systems Branch at a ceremony in Dundigal, marking a significant modernization step in its operational capabilities. This branch, created to unify

weapon system operators and enhance efficiency, includes four specialized streams: Surface-to-Surface Missiles, Surface-to-Air Missiles, Remotely Piloted Aircraft, and Twin/Multi-Crew Aircraft Operations. The rigorous training includes foundational courses at the Air Force Academy followed by specialized instruction at the Weapon Systems School. Air Chief Marshal Choudhari highlighted that this initiative will not only improve combat effectiveness but also generate substantial savings, estimated at over Rs 3,400 crore, by streamlining training processes. This strategic shift reflects India's commitment to integrating advanced technologies and enhancing its military readiness in a rapidly evolving geopolitical landscape.

# Indian Navy Pursues Indigenous Diesel Engines for Project-76 Submarines Share

15-Dec-24

India's Project-76 aims to develop indigenous diesel-electric attack submarines, with the Indian Navy seeking locally produced diesel engines for enhanced self-reliance and supply chain reliability. A private company is in talks to supply engines that will also support future nuclear submarines under Project-77, showcasing strategic dual-use potential. This initiative underscores India's commitment to strengthening its defense industrial base and reducing reliance on foreign suppliers, ultimately enhancing maritime capabilities and strategic autonomy. Additionally, experts assert that India can effectively counter threats, such as drones from neighboring countries, indicating robust defense readiness amidst ongoing regional security challenges.

# Indian Navy Approves Tapas UAVs for Enhanced Maritime Surveillance State

15-Dec-24

The Indian Navy has approved the procurement of 10 Tapas Medium Altitude Long Endurance UAVs for maritime surveillance, to be stationed at the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, despite the recent induction of the Drishti-10 UAVs as interim measures. The Tapas, developed by DRDO, is being refined to meet performance criteria, including a service ceiling of 30,000 feet. This strategic move aims to secure vital maritime routes in the Indian Ocean while enhancing operational flexibility, complementing existing orders of 15 MQ-9 Sea Guardian UAVs from the U.S. The focus on UAV reflects India's indigenous development commitment to bolstering its defense capabilities and ensuring readiness in diverse operational environments.

# Bharat Forge Boosts Maritime Innovation with 25% Stake in Edgelab Share

15-Dec-24

Bharat Forge Ltd has acquired a 25% stake in Italian firm Edgelab SpA, known for its autonomous underwater vehicles (AUVs), marking a strategic shift into marine robotics. This acquisition aims to enhance Bharat Forge's technological capabilities while diversifying its portfolio, with applications in scientific research, port security, and defense. The partnership is expected to drive innovation in underwater technology, potentially benefiting maritime operations in India and globally, especially as underwater resource security gains prominence. This move positions Bharat Forge as a key player in the defense sector, reinforcing India's push towards advanced maritime capabilities and collaboration in cutting-edge technology.

# Indian Navy to Equip Nuclear Submarines with Hypersonic Missiles Share

15-Dec-24

The Indian Navy is set to enhance its capabilities with the induction of a 1,500-km Long-Range Hypersonic Anti-Ship Missile (LRAShM), as confirmed by Navy Chief Admiral D.K. Tripathi. This advanced system will initially be integrated into surface warships, with future plans to deploy it on nuclear attack submarines by 2036, which will be equipped with Vertical Launch Systems (VLS). The LRAShM will serve as a high-impact conventional strike weapon, complementing other advanced armaments being developed for these submarines. This strategic move reflects India's commitment to modernizing its naval arsenal and strengthening its defensive and offensive posture in the Indo-Pacific region.

# HAL to Integrate Mini-AESA Radar in LCH Prachand for Enhanced Combat Share

15-Dec-24

Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) is exploring the integration of a small Active Electronically Scanned Array (AESA) radar into India's Light Combat Helicopter (LCH) Prachand, which aims to enhance combat capabilities through improved situational awareness. This radar will enable the LCH to detect and engage targets with precision in complex environments, addressing modern threats like enemy drones. The Indian Army sees potential for the LCH in counter-drone operations, and the radar's advanced features may also be adapted for unmanned combat aerial vehicles. Approval from the Indian Army and Air Force is required before testing, which, if successful, would bolster

India's strategic advantage in both conventional and asymmetrical warfare.

# India Develops Indigenous Pulse TWT for Fighter Jet Warfare S SHARE

15-Dec-24

India's Technology Development Fund is advancing its defense capabilities by developing an indigenous Pulse Traveling Wave Tube (Pulse TWT) for the Active Self-Protection Jammer (ASPJ), crucial for electronic warfare on fighter jets. This project aims to reduce dependence on imports, enhance operational flexibility, and ensure reliability in diverse mission scenarios. The Pulse TWT is essential for generating high-power RF pulses necessary for jamming enemy radar, addressing current challenges of high costs and logistical complexities associated with imported components. This initiative reflects India's commitment to self-reliance in defense technology, emphasizing rigorous testing and scalability to meet future needs effectively.

# ADA Advances Tejas MkII with Iron Bird Test Facility for 2026 Launch Share

15-Dec-24

The Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA) is making strides in the development of the Tejas MkII with the upcoming operationalization of its Iron Bird test facility, crucial for validating the aircraft's systems prior to its maiden flight. This full-scale mock-up will simulate various functionalities, focusing on the Flight Control System, thereby allowing rigorous pre-flight testing and refinement of operational procedures. Scheduled for rollout by late 2025 and its first flight in March 2026, the Iron Bird will significantly mitigate risks associated with flight testing, enhancing both safety and efficiency in the program's timeline, ultimately supporting India's defense capabilities and self-reliance in military aviation.

# India Launches Seventh LSAM-14 Missile Cum Ammunition Barge Share

15-Dec-24

The Indian defense sector marked a significant milestone with the launch of the seventh Missile Cum Ammunition Barge, LSAM-14, as part of a contract for eight barges with SECON Engineering Projects Pvt Ltd. These barges, designed in collaboration with an Indian ship design firm and rigorously tested for seaworthiness, are crucial for the Indian Navy's operational logistics, facilitating the transportation and handling of ammunition. With six barges already delivered and actively supporting naval operations, this

initiative embodies the "Make in India" and "Aatmanirbhar Bharat" campaigns, underscoring India's commitment to enhancing indigenous defense capabilities and reinforcing maritime preparedness.

### **Geopolitics and Security Alliances**

# India Reinforces Commitment to a Free Indo-Pacific Region Share Share

15-Dec-24

Army Chief Gen Upendra Dwivedi reaffirmed India's commitment to a free, open, and inclusive Indo-Pacific during a virtual address at a land forces summit in Japan, attended by military leaders from nations such as the US, Australia, and Japan. He emphasized the importance of multinational defense cooperation to address shared security challenges, particularly in light of China's growing military presence in the region. Gen Dwivedi's remarks highlight India's strategic perspective in the Indian Ocean Region and its dedication to regional stability and respect for international law. This summit served as a vital platform for collaborating on security issues, showcasing India's leadership role in promoting peaceful coexistence and strengthening alliances with key partners in the Indo-Pacific.

# India and Israel: United Against Security Threats and Extremism Share

Israeli Consul General Kobbi Shoshani highlighted the shared security challenges and threats of extremism faced by India and Israel during the World Hindu Economic Forum 2024. He condemned the violence against the Hindu community in Bangladesh and emphasized the historical ties between Jews and Indians. Shoshani advocated for ongoing collaboration between the two nations, linking military strength to economic stability, and underscoring Israel's view of India as its closest ally in Asia. He also noted that crises can spur innovation, referencing advancements in various fields, reinforcing the necessity of a robust military for national stability and growth.

# General Ashok Raj Sigdel's Visit to India: Strengthening Ties SHARE

The visit of Suprabal Janasewashree General Ashok Raj Sigdel, Chief of the Army Staff of the Nepali Army, to India from December 11 to 14, 2024, significantly strengthened the military ties between Nepal and India.

Key discussions with Indian Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi focused on expanding bilateral cooperation in strategic and defense areas, resulting in several initiatives aimed at deepening the longstanding friendship between the two nations. This engagement highlights the mutual commitment to enhance collaboration and reflects India's proactive approach in fostering regional partnerships, which is vital for maintaining stability and security in the South Asian context.

### US Likely to Reject Bangladesh's F-16 Bid Amid India Concerns State

Bangladesh's bid to acquire F-16 fighter jets from the U.S. is likely to face rejection due to concerns over regional stability, particularly regarding India's strategic posture. The U.S. has previously denied similar requests, notably in 1999, citing Bangladesh's military procurements from Russia and the implications for geostrategic balance in South Asia. Current U.S. assessments suggest that advanced aircraft may not align with Bangladesh's strategic needs, given its geographical context dominated by India. This situation reinforces India's defense posture and highlights its influence in regional security dynamics, as the U.S. remains cautious about arming nations in close proximity to India.

# India and Israel Unite Against Common Security Threats Share

The Israeli envoy, Shoshani, highlighted shared security challenges between India and Israel, emphasizing solidarity against extremism, particularly referencing Hamas's actions. He posited that crises can drive innovation, potentially advancing sectors telecommunications and medical technology. Stressing the link between military strength and economic stability, he declared that a strong economy cannot exist alongside a weak military. This perspective reinforces India's ongoing commitment to enhancing its defense capabilities, particularly in the face of regional threats, and signals the importance of international partnerships in tackling common security concerns effectively while fostering technological progress.

# Amit Shah to Lead Security Review Meeting on J&K, Dec 19 S SHARE

15-Dec-24

Home Minister Amit Shah will lead a high-level security review meeting on December 19, focusing on strategies

for peace and stability in Jammu and Kashmir (J&K). Key officials, including J&K's Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha and National Security Advisor Ajit Doval, along with senior military leaders, will evaluate successful security plans like the area domination and zero terror plans, which have proven effective in the Kashmir valley and are now being extended to the Jammu region. Additionally, the meeting will address the ongoing demand for the restoration of statehood to J&K, which was restructured as a Union Territory in 2019, reflecting the government's balanced approach to governance and security in the region.

# Bangladesh's New Politics Threaten Stability with India in IOR S SHARE

The political landscape in Bangladesh has shifted with a new interim government under Professor Muhammad Yunus, causing a rift in its traditionally stable relations with India. Growing anti-India sentiment, driven by opposition parties feeling marginalized due to India's past support for Sheikh Hasina, raises concerns about regional stability, particularly as Bangladesh may lean towards the US and potentially China. This shift could undermine maritime cooperation and collaborative efforts in the Bay of Bengal, essential for addressing shared challenges. For India, it becomes crucial to recalibrate its diplomatic strategy, fostering constructive dialogue while respecting Bangladesh's sovereignty to maintain stability along its eastern frontier.

### Israel Maintains Military Vigilance Amid Syrian Rebel Shift Share

Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz has stated that threats from Syria persist, despite a moderate tone from new rebel leaders following the ousting of President Bashar al-Assad. Israel has intensified including military actions. incursions demilitarized zone and airstrikes on strategic weapon stockpiles, claiming these measures are necessary for border security. The Syrian leadership emphasizes a focus on reconstruction and diplomatic solutions, rejecting military confrontations. This ongoing tension highlights Israel's strategic concerns about the stability of its northern border amid changing power dynamics in Syria, underscoring the need for a robust defense posture in a volatile regional environment.

# Turkey Offers Military Support to New Islamist-Led Syrian Government State

Turkey's Defense Minister Yasar Guler announced the country's readiness to provide military support to Syria's newly established Islamist-led government, formed by rebels who ousted Bashar al-Assad. Guler emphasized the importance of giving the new administration, associated with the Hayat Tahrir al-Sham rebel alliance, a chance to prove itself. Despite being labeled a terrorist organization by many, HTS has claimed to moderate its stance and support Syrian rights and governance. This development highlights Turkey's strategic interests in Syria, potentially influencing regional stability and the balance of power against various factions and external influences, particularly concerning international governance and security dynamics.

### **Military Operations**

### BRO Accelerates Border Fencing at India-Myanmar in Moreh S SHARE

15-Dec-24

The Border Roads Organisation (BRO) has intensified its efforts to erect fencing along the India-Myanmar border near Moreh in Manipur's Tengnoupal district, a critical move given the 1,643 km border's history of smuggling arms and narcotics. Currently, only 10 km of this border is fenced, with the comprehensive project expected to cost Rs 31,000 crore. Undertaken by Project Sewak, the initiative aims to enhance border security and control illegal activities. This strategic measure underscores India's commitment to fortifying its borders and ensuring national security amid rising regional challenges, particularly in areas prone to cross-border crime.

# Militant Killed and Six Arrested in Manipur Security Operations SHARE

In recent operations in Manipur, significant actions by security forces have led to the killing of a militant and the apprehension of six others in Thoubal District, where a large cache of arms, including multiple rifles and ammunition, was recovered. This encounter occurred after armed militants attacked the police during a routine patrol. Concurrently, search operations in Imphal East and Kangpokpi districts yielded further recoveries of firearms, including an assault rifle and

hand grenades, indicating ongoing security challenges in the region. The actions of the Manipur Police Commandos underscore their commitment to maintaining law and order in an area affected by insurgency, while the recovery of arms highlights the persistent threats posed by militant groups. Overall, these operations reflect the proactive stance of Indian security forces in combating militancy and enhancing regional stability.

# India Ready to Counter Any Bayraktar Drone Threat from Bangladesh Share

Recent tensions in India-Bangladesh relations have escalated due to Bangladesh's acquisition of Bayraktar TB2 drones, raising Indian security concerns. Experts assert that India can effectively track and neutralize any such drone intruding into its airspace, citing past instances of successful intercepts. Furthermore, India's defense capabilities are bolstered by advancements in indigenous technologies, demonstrated as MIDHANI's development of the SN-41 superalloy for jet engines and missiles, and the Indian Navy's pursuit of local diesel engines for Project-76 submarines. These developments collectively enhance India's strategic posture in the region, ensuring robust defense readiness against potential aerial threats.

# Amit Shah Aims to Eradicate Naxalism in Chhattisgarh by 2026 SHARE

Union Home Minister Amit Shah has expressed confidence in eliminating Naxalism from Chhattisgarh by March 2026, commending the state police's significant progress against Left-wing extremism, including the neutralization of 287 extremists and arrest of nearly 1,000 in a year. He noted a remarkable decline in fatalities among security forces and civilians due to effective operations, attributing this success to the leadership of Prime Minister Modi. Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai highlighted various welfare schemes for surrendered Maoists, aiming to reintegrate them into society and support victims of Maoist violence, reinforcing the commitment to a peaceful and developed Chhattisgarh.

# BSF Jawan Injured in IED Blast During Anti-Naxalite Operation Share

A BSF jawan, B Ishwar Rao, was injured in an IED explosion while his team was attempting to neutralize a device planted by Naxalites in Chhattisgarh's Kanker

district. The incident occurred during an area domination operation near the Panidobir camp, resulting in minor injuries to the jawan's hand and face. He received initial treatment and was being transferred to a hospital for further care. Union Home Minister Amit Shah's visit to Raipur highlights the government's focus on addressing security challenges in the region, emphasizing a strong response against Naxalite activities and the commitment to safeguarding personnel engaged in counter-insurgency operations.

## Assam Rifles Dismantles 354 Acres of Illegal Poppy Farms in 2024 S SHARE

## Israeli airstrikes in Gaza kill 20, including at a school shelter. S SHARE

Israeli troops recently killed at least 20 Palestinians in airstrikes targeting areas in the northern Gaza Strip, including a school sheltering displaced residents. This ongoing conflict, which escalated after Hamas's attack on Israel on October 7, has resulted in significant casualties, with Israeli authorities reporting 1,200 deaths and over 250 hostages taken. In total, almost 45,000 have died in Gaza, primarily civilians, due to Israel's extensive military operations. While efforts by Egypt, Qatar, and the U.S. to broker a truce are underway, no significant progress has been achieved, highlighting the complex and dire humanitarian situation unfolding in the region.

# NIA charges Hakam Khan over deadly bus attack on pilgrims in J&K SHARE

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a chargesheet against Hakam Khan, linked to the terrorist attack on a bus carrying pilgrims in Jammu and Kashmir, which occurred on June 9, 2024. The attack resulted in the deaths of eight pilgrims and serious injuries to 41 others, initiated by unidentified terrorists. Hakam Khan reportedly provided logistical support, aiding in the attack's planning and execution. This incident highlights the ongoing threat of terrorism in the region, necessitating stringent counter-terrorism measures by Indian authorities. The NIA's swift action underscores India's commitment to ensuring the safety of its citizens and upholding law and order in sensitive areas like Jammu and Kashmir.
