France Set to Order Next-Gen Nuclear Aircraft Carrier in 2025

DR Congo Considers India's Tejas Mk1 as Su-25 Frogfoot Replacement SHARE

The Democratic Republic of Congo's air force is working to modernize its fleet, with India as a key partner in this initiative. The discussions indicate a growing defense partnership between India and DR Congo, which could also lead to collaborative training and technology transfer, further strengthening regional defense ties.

IAF's Mirage 2000 Deal with Qatar in Doubt as Alternatives Are Explored SHARE

Qatar's offer to sell 12 upgraded Mirage 2000-5 fighter jets to the Indian Air Force has initiated critical discussions amid the IAF's need to replace retiring MiGs. Although the Qatari jets could enhance capabilities, negotiations are hampered by price disputes, with the IAF seeking a lower cost and contemplating the acquisition of the Tejas MkII as a long-term solution. This

decision reflects the IAF's balancing act between immediate needs and strategic future planning. The proposed sale of Mirage 2000-5s highlights the IAF's urgency to modernize its fleet while grappling with budget constraints. The potential acquisition serves as a bridge between acquiring immediate capabilities and fostering indigenous development through the Tejas MkII. Balancing the operational gap against the urgency for enhanced combat readiness will shape India's defense strategy in the coming years, emphasizing the need for a pragmatic approach to procurement in an evolving security landscape.

IAF Pursues Drone Solutions to Replace Jaguars for Deep Strike Missions SHARE

The Indian Air Force (IAF) plans to replace its Jaguar deep penetration strike aircraft with unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) by 2035. Israel Takes Out Senior Hezbollah Drone Commander
