## Defense Business and Industry

### Hanwha Ocean Seeks Partnerships with Indian Shipyards to Boost Growth

South Korea's Hanwha Ocean is actively seeking strategic partnerships with Indian shipyards to address a global surge in shipbuilding demand amid limited capacity in South Korea. A high-level delegation visited several Indian facilities, including Cochin and Hindustan Shipyards, with the aim of exploring investment and technological collaboration, potentially leading to technology transfers and joint ventures. This initiative aligns with India's maritime development and self-reliance goals, aiming to enhance its shipbuilding capabilities and establish itself as a regional hub. The collaboration could significantly bolster India's defense and commercial shipping sectors, tapping into advanced Korean technologies and fostering a robust maritime industry.

### Indonesian Navy Chief Explores Defense Ties with BrahMos Aerospace

A high-level delegation from the Indonesian Navy, led by Admiral Muhammad Ali, visited BrahMos Aerospace in India to discuss a potential \$450 million deal for the export of BrahMos supersonic cruise missiles. This visit highlights the strengthening military ties between India and Indonesia, particularly in defense technology and strategic collaboration in the Indo-Pacific region. The BrahMos missile system, recognized for its speed and versatility, is set to enhance Indonesia's defense capabilities as it aims to bolster its indigenous

manufacturing and strategic maritime security. The discussions included joint development projects and training programs, further solidifying India's role as a key defense partner in Southeast Asia and enhancing regional security dynamics amidst evolving geopolitical challenges.

### Indian MRO sector to grow 50% by FY26, driven by fleet expansion.

The Indian aircraft maintenance, repair, and overhaul (MRO) industry is projected to experience a 50% increase in topline growth, reaching Rs 4,500 crore by FY26, driven by fleet expansions and reduced GST on aircraft components. This growth is expected to enhance profitability margins and improve credit profiles, with Indian MROs aiming to capture up to 20% of the domestic market by next fiscal. While currently only 14% of MRO spending is with Indian firms, efforts to upgrade hangar capacities and upskill workforce are underway. The improved operational scale and higher-margin services should lead to better cash flows and increased market competitiveness against overseas players.

### India Joins Eurodrone Program to Enhance Domestic UAV Projects

India has joined the Eurodrone programme as an observer state, marking a significant step in enhancing its UAV capabilities. The Aeronautical Development Establishment (ADE) will represent India, gaining insights into technological advancements and operational methodologies crucial for domestic projects like the Tapas UAV. This partnership will strengthen strategic ties with European nations and open avenues for future co-development opportunities,

diversifying India's defense technology sources beyond existing U.S. partnerships. By participating in this initiative, India positions itself to integrate global best practices into its defense ecosystem, ultimately reinforcing its aerial surveillance and reconnaissance capabilities in the Indo-Pacific region.

## U.S. Air Force Cancels F-35, F-16 Demos at Aero India 2025 [SHARE](#)

## Kiran UAV's CATS OMCA Debut at Aero India 2025: A Strategic Leap [SHARE](#)

The Kiran UAV, reconfigured under the Combat Air Teaming System (CATS) Optionally Manned Combat Aircraft (OMCA) program, is set to be unveiled at Aero India 2025, showcasing its transformation from a trainer to an advanced unmanned aerial vehicle. Originally developed by Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) in 1985, the Kiran UAV can operate autonomously or under ground control, serving dual roles in reconnaissance and engaging enemy defenses. This strategic repurposing exemplifies India's innovative approach to defense spending and asset optimization, while potentially opening avenues for international partnerships and exports in the defense sector, further solidifying India's position in the global defense landscape.

## HAL to Start Producing AL-55I Engines for HJT-36 Trainers [SHARE](#)

The successful integration of domestically produced engines will bolster India's self-reliance in defense aviation and ensure that IAF pilots receive comprehensive training for modern combat scenarios.

## Indian Army to Order 100 More K-9 Vajra Howitzers for Desert Ops

## Saab Goes Solo for MRFA Bid, Eyes FDI-backed Indian Assembly

## Russia's Su-75 Checkmate Fighter Delayed Amid Sanctions Challenges SHARE

## Iran Showcases AI-Enhanced Missiles in Gulf Military Drills SHARE

## Geopolitics and Security Alliances

### Indian Navy Welcomes Indonesian Delegation to Boost Maritime Ties SHARE

Rana's association with David Coleman Headley, a key conspirator, underscores the international dimension of terrorism that India faces, and his testimony may further illuminate the planning and execution of the attacks, potentially implicating agencies like the ISI in orchestrating such heinous acts.

## Car Bomb Blast in Khuzdar, Pakistan: 2 Dead, 7 Injured [SHARE](#)

A car bomb explosion in Khuzdar, Pakistan, resulted in two fatalities and seven injuries, with the critically injured being treated at the local trauma center. Security forces, including police and Frontier Corps, quickly secured the area for investigations. ## 27 Soldiers Killed in Deadly ISWAP Suicide Attack in Nigeria [SHARE](#)

## Cybersecurity and Information Warfare

### Healthcare Leads in Cyberattacks, Education Follows: Report [SHARE](#)

The Indian healthcare sector is facing an alarming surge in cyberattacks, with an average of 8,614 weekly attacks per organization, as reported by Check Point Software Technologies. Following healthcare, the education sector and government/military are also heavily targeted. The report highlights a significant increase in the sophistication of attacks, including the use of generative AI, and reveals a 44% rise in global cyberattacks year-over-year. This underscores the urgent need for enhanced cybersecurity measures in India, particularly to safeguard critical infrastructure and maintain public trust in digital systems amidst evolving threats.

The BNP expressed its disagreement with banning political parties, suggesting a potential for dialogue regarding the Awami League's role in politics, thus reflecting a complex political landscape amidst ongoing upheaval in Bangladesh.

This finding serves as a critical warning about the ethical boundaries and governance of advanced AI technologies.

## CERT-In Warns Windows and Mac Users: Update Google Chrome Now

India's cybersecurity watchdog, CERT-In, has issued warnings regarding critical vulnerabilities in Google Chrome that affect Windows and Mac users, specifically versions prior to 132.0.6834.83 and 132.0.6834.110, respectively. These vulnerabilities could allow hackers to execute arbitrary code, leading to data breaches and system instability. CERT-In urges users to promptly update their browsers to close these security gaps. This situation underscores the need for robust cybersecurity measures, especially as digital threats grow more sophisticated. Proactive engagement in software updates is crucial for safeguarding sensitive information and maintaining overall system integrity.

## US and Colombia Strike Deal on Deporting Migrants, Easing Tensions

The new launch pad will support India's ambitions in space exploration, including plans for a lunar landing by 2040, and is a strategic move to bolster India's position in global space endeavors, ensuring readiness for increased launch frequencies and complex missions.

## Govt Seeks Enhanced Control Over Enemy Properties for Public Use

The Indian government is advancing a bill to amend the Enemy Property Act, seeking greater control over enemy assets for public purposes following a recent Supreme Court ruling. This proposal allows the central government to directly acquire enemy properties, which have been under custodianship since the 1962 Defence of India Act. Since 2017, the definition of "enemy subject" has broadened, and over the past six years, the government has monetized enemy properties worth nearly ₹3,500 crore. Approximately 9,400 enemy properties, valued at ₹1 lakh crore, are set for disposal, reflecting India's strategic approach to manage these assets effectively while bolstering its economic interests.
